DUII issued following wreck on mountain

Last Thursday the Hoodland Rural Fire Department and the Oregon State Forestry Service fought a brush fire in the Cedar Ridge area near Brightwood.

At 4:30 p.m. that same day the department responded to an accident an eighth of a mile west of the Mirror Lake trail head on Highway 26.

Armintrout said that upon arrival they discovered a vehicle had hit a metal guardrail, blocking the westbound lane of traffic. Both the driver and a passenger were pinned in the wreckage.

The vehicle, a 1971 Mercury Cougar, had to be cut open in order to free the trapped passengers, said Armintrout.

Rescue personnel utilized a hydrolicly-operated cutting tool that is sometimes referred to as

"the jaws of life." The gas-operated tool also has the capacity to spread 12,000 pounds of wreckage in order to get to trapped passengers.

An Oregon State Police spokesperson identified the driver as Marlene T. Badroad, 28, from Warm Springs. The passenger was Georgia Greene, also of Warm Springs.

Badroad and Greene were transported to Gresham Community Hospital by Alpine Ambulance.

Greene was treated in the emergency room for minor injuries and later released. Badroad was admitted for injuries received in the mishaps, and was listed in satisfactory condition Tuesday afternoon.

Badroad, who was reportedly driving without an operator's license and without insurance, and was cited, according to the OSP, for driving while under the influence of intoxicants.
