

**'Call 'em as I see 'em'**

**Tax court candidate pledges**

If elected judge of the Oregon Tax Court, Samuel B. Stewart would be free to "call 'em as I see 'em."

That's one reason Stewart retired early as tax counsel for the Union Pacific Corporation.

Born in Sellwood, Stewart was anxious to return home, from Omaha, Neb. "I wanted to do something different," he told The Post.

He currently is practicing law in Lake Oswego. But, he points out, when one works for a corporate client or an individual, one is not able to call 'em as they see 'em.

Stewart left Union Pacific in 1979, at the age of 56. He would be 60 when taking office if elected judge of the Oregon Tax Court.

He said he feels strongly about serving only one six-year term.

People who serve in a position for too long get far removed from how others live, he said.

There has never been a contested election for judge of the tax court, which may be one reason few know about the office, Stewart pointed out.

Carlisle Roberts, who has served since 1970, is basically a "government" person, while Stewart said he has experience working with government,

business and individuals.

As counsel to the Oregon Tax Commission, Stewart said he recommended and supported the formation of a tax court.

The Oregon Tax Court, established in 1961, has final authority for the hearing and final determination of all questions arising under the tax laws of the state, subject to review only by appeal to the Oregon Supreme Court.

Stewart, during the seven years he was on the Tax Commission, was responsible for supervising property tax administration. In that capacity he carried out a program initiated by the Legislature to eliminate the wide discrepancies in assessed values of property, which, he said, made him unpopular with some groups.

As a result of that experience, he drafted the open space bill while chairman of the Multnomah County Planning Commission. That bill, passed by the Legislature in 1971, permitted a lower assessment on undeveloped land in urban and suburban areas. This helped avoid the forced development of such land caused by high assessments, he said.

Stewart graduated from Lewis and Clark College in 1948 and received a law degree from the Willamette University College of Law in 1949.

He's served as assistant attorney general, as a partner in the White, Sutherland and White law firm, and on the Brookings Institution's tax advisory group to the Republic of Korea.

Also running for judge of the Oregon Tax Court is Carl M. Byers of Salem.

The election is May 18.

**Kiwanians celebrate 35 years of service**

The Sandy Oregon Kiwanis Club recently hosted 160 persons at an anniversary banquet to celebrate the club's 35th birthday.

The Sandy Club is well-known throughout the Pacific Northwest for its Fly-In Breakfast, which is held annually on the third Sunday in July at Rich's Airport near Sandy.

Fifty to 60 Kiwanians from Oregon, Washington and Idaho make it a point to fly to this event in their own airplanes. The proceeds provide a substantial portion of the funds required to support the club's youth projects, charitable activities and contribution to the Kiwanis Mt. Hood Handicapped Children's Camp.

**Fitness club repays charter members**

Sandy area residents who may have been original members of Fitness Unlimited, a Gresham health club, may now seek cancellation of their contracts and a refund under terms of an agreement signed this week.

Oregon's Consumer Protection and Services Division negotiated the voluntary compliance agree-

ment after a number of customer complaints and the sale of Fitness Unlimited last November.

The business was subsequently changed to the Family Fitness Center.

According to the agreement, anyone who purchased a Fitness Unlimited membership can receive a refund if the request shows sufficient legal cause to

cancel their contract.

Customers who think they have a legitimate complaint should put it in writing, sign the statement and forward it to the Division. Requests must be made within 60 days to: Consumer Protection and Services Division, 520 SW Yamhill, Portland, OR 97204.

If a refund request is denied because there

wasn't sufficient legal cause given to cancel the contract or for any other reason, an explanation will be forwarded to the customer.

Customers of Fitness Unlimited who wish to submit a refund request are asked to be as specific as possible in their letter and include any documentation available to support their claim.

**Sandy man pleads not guilty to harassment**

A Sandy man entered a plea of not guilty last week in Canby Municipal Court on a charge of harassment.

Arthur Skipper was charged with harassment after an incident that occurred at the Timber Valley League district wrestling tournament.

The charge, filed by Vynn C. Berg, a referee, accuses Skipper of "hitting him (Berg) with open hands and pushing him in a manner likely to provoke a violent or disorderly response."
