

## Airport hearing April 14

Plans for a new subdivision south of Sandy will be discussed this Wednesday with the Clackamas County hearings officer in Oregon.

Arthur Skipper, owner of Country Squire Airpark, proposes to develop a 24-lot planned unit development subdivision on a private drive southwest of the intersection of SE Bornstedt and SE Winery Roads.

The hearing will be held at 2 p.m. April 14 at the Department of Environmental Services, 902 Abernethy Road, Oregon City.

Monday, Paul Sanders of Portland will take his plan for a hydroelectric project before the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners. The hearings officer has already recommended denial of the application for a conditional use.

Volunteers are needed to staff the clinic. Duties will include registration,

weighing and measuring of children, and collecting fees.

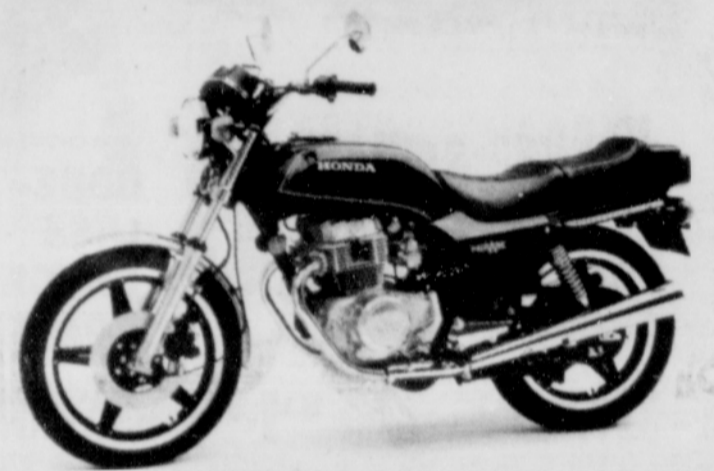
