

Sweet Home proven no match for Pioneers

A number of personal records were set last week at Sweet Home in the rain and sleet, with the Sandy boys winning 82-63 and the girls winning 76-51.

Sam Romey set a sophomore record in the 3000-meter run, winning in 9:18.8.

He also won the 1500, with a 4:16.73.

Phil Burks finished second in the 1500, in 4:34.7, giving Sandy a one-two punch there.

Russell Fork turned in a personal best, winning the 400-meter run with a time of 53.3.

Bill Bowman set a personal record in the 110-meter high hurdles, finishing second with a time of 18.6.

Steve Metelak won the 800 with a time of 2:05.5.

Steve Brader won the 300-meter intermediate hurdles with a time of 44.27.

Roland Aumueller turned in "just an outstanding performance," winning the shot put with a 47.7 and a half toss. That's a seven foot improvement over last year.

The Pioneers made a clean sweep in the discus, with Mike Marleau winning, and Locke Christman

and Steve Pettingill taking second and third, respectively.

Brader, Ryan Coombs and Steve Ackerman swept the 100, with Brader winning in 12.2.

The Pioneers also won the 1600- and 400-meter relays.

Fork, Doug Baucom, Metelak and Ackerman comprised the 1600, while Coombs, Tyson Cummings, Brader and Fork comprised the 400-meter relay.

All in all, the boys won 10 of 17 events.

For the girls, Sharon Jensen is starting to get in shape for track, according to Hutchinson. She won the 1500 with a 5:07, while Laura Stringham finished third. Stringham is getting her times down, Hutchinson reports.

Crystal Calkins turned in a personal record in the 100-meter dash, running a 13.6. "That's a great time, considering the weather," Hutchinson said.

Polly Kelly stayed "right on target" as far as her times. She won the 400 with a 62.5.

Kecia Harris was credited with turning in a good performance in the 100-meter high hurdles,

finishing second in 19.1. "Darby Binder turned in the best on-track performance we've had," Hutchinson said. The senior, in "unbelievable condition," ran a 2:24.4 in the 800, a personal record.

Binder and Jensen finished second and third, respectively, in the 3000-meter run.

Lisa Hassett turned in a personal record for the second consecutive week in the 200, running a 23.7. "She looked excellent," Hutchinson said.

Margaret Blackburn turned in "a fine effort," finishing second in the 300 intermediate hurdles.

Paige Daugherty set another personal record in

the shot, throwing it 38-6 and three-quarters.

"That was a great effort," Hutchinson said. Stephanie Hagstrom was also credited with throwing the shot well. She finished second, with a toss of 32-8 and three-quarters.

Hagstrom finished second in the discus throw. Daugherty won the javelin throw.

Jensen, throwing the javelin for the first time in competition, finished second.

The Pioneers swept the high jump, with Shelby Dries setting a personal record with her five-foot jump.

Shaun Thoreson finished second and Gayle Roth

third. Both jumped 4-10.

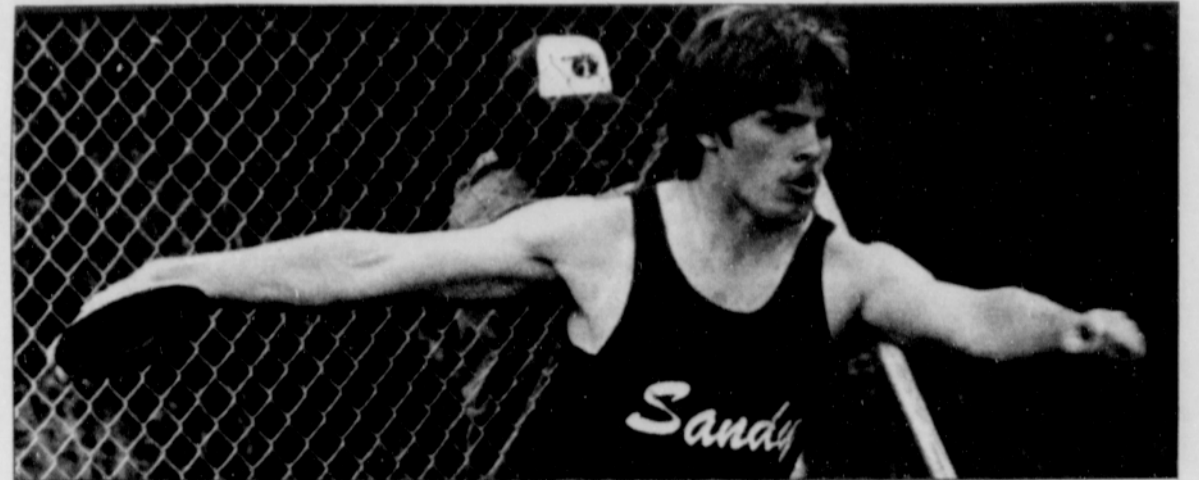
Jensen won the long jump, "with an exceptional

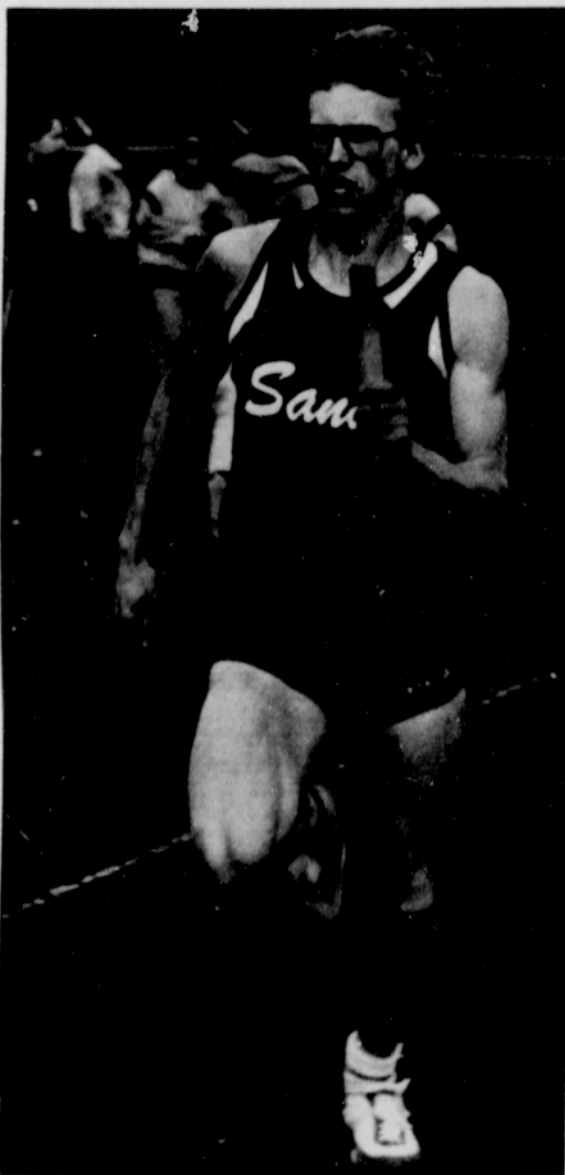
