County planners extend deadline

The Clackamas County Planning Division has given citizen planning organizations, interested citizens and agencies until April 20 to respond to a discussion draft of a hydroelectric facility ordinance.
The proposed ordinance established the siting criteria and the standards pertaining to the installation of hydroelectric facilities.
"Any facility relating to the production of electricity by waterpower, including, but not limited to the power generating plants, penstocks, navigation locks, fish ladders, fish screens, reservoirs and detention areas, recreation facilities, interconnecting transmission lines, substations, access roads, officers or com-

mercial and industrial structures proposed to be built in connection with the energy facility; and activities involved in their construction and operation," would be the subject of the provisions of the ordinance.
Hydroelectric facilities over 25,000 kilowatts would be subject to a county hearings officer review, or a joint state and county hearing.
Any facility producing 74.6 kilowatts or less would be reviewed by county staff.
Facilities with a capacity of generating 25,000 kilowatts or less would also be subject to a hearings officer review.
The county has scheduled no public hearings at this time before the planning commission, where additional testimony will be received pertaining to the proposed hydro ordinance.
