TAX BASE FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

QUESTION: Shall a new tax base of \$10,427,016 be authorized for continuing educational programs at Mt. Hood Community College?

PURPOSE: Mt. Hood Community College offers vocational, lower division transfer, and continuing education courses to more than 20,000 adult students each year at a cost per student less than the state average for community colleges and public schools. These programs are financed by state aid, student tuition and fees, local property taxes and other sources. The college's current tax base authority of \$6,350,667 is not sufficient to meet current program needs, despite significant increases in tuition and fees, because of increased costs and reduced state aid.

For 1982-83, the operational budget of the college will require only \$8,372,305 of this authority to be levied.

Now that enrollment has stabilized, the new tax base will permit existing programs to continue at present levels.
