Ron's, Thriftway gain 'C' finals

As expected, Williams Thriftway and Ron's No Place-Boeing will be playing each other for first place in the "C" division post-season basketball tournament.

Meeting in the first tournament game, Ron's-Boeing rallied in the fourth quarter to squeak by Williams Thriftway, 41-40. Joe Kern scored 15 points, seven in the last quarter. Behind Bruce Dausavage's 17 points, P & C Construction stayed in the winner's bracket, upsetting the T-Talk Presbyterians, 51-42. Roger Ford scored 14 points for T-Talk.

Friday night Ron's-Boeing remained undefeated by whitewashing P & C Construction, 39-28. Ahead by only two points at halftime, Ron's-Boeing outscored P & C Construction 11-2 in the third quarter and stayed even in the fourth to win.
