Parents and volunteers representing the Welches area baseball and softball programs have been working hard the past few weeks preparing two fields for the coming season.

Dan Wolf, a district representative to the Tri-County Board of the American Softball Association (ASA), said the main field adjacent to Salmon River Road in Zigzag will be ready for opening day, set for May 12.

## Hunter safety class offered
