

## Sandy swimmer wins in the kick

A number of swimmers did well at a Sextathlon sponsored by the Eastmont Aquatic Club at Reynolds High School Saturday and Sunday.

Each swimmer participated in six events, including freestyle (two lengths), breast stroke, butterfly, back stroke and an individual medley comprised of all four strokes. Awards were based on cumulative times for all six events.

Those who placed include Damon Hodge, who was first in the 8 and under boys division, Michelle Crane, who was fourth in the 9-10 girls division, Ian Hodge, who was seventh in the 9-10 boys division, and Richard Rolph, who was fourth in the 13-14 boys division.

Coach Carl Neuenfeldt said an outstanding performance was turned in by Gaylord Miller, who dropped 24 seconds off his previous best times. He competed in the 9-10 boys division.

Miller's personal bests included a 3:03.3 200 free, a 34:57 50 free, a 47:06 50 fly and a 1:32.48 100 individual medley.

Hodge was also credited with swimming well. He had to battle to the last stroke for the first-place finish. He came from behind in the last race, the individual medley, to win with a time of 1:21.50. He received a first-place plaque.

Michelle Crane turned in three personal bests and was credited for swimming competitively.

Her personal bests included a 41.5 50 breast, a 40.5 50 back, and a 39.34 50 breast. All together her times dropped 2.3 seconds.

Personal bests were also turned in by Ian Hodge (9-10 boys, 50 breast, 45.64), Mark Rolph (100 breast, 1:27.73; 100 back, 1:30.7; 100 free, 1:09.42; 100 fly, 1:30.3), Nikki Hanson (8 and under girls, 25 free, 24.07; 25 fly, 29.34), Dean Haines (13-14 boys, 500 free, 6:21.84; 100 breast, 1:35.88; 100 fly, 1:13.1), and Rolph (500 free, 5:24.9; 100 breast, 1:35.88; 100 fly, 1:03.1).

Neuenfeldt also announced that Michelle Crane and Gaylord Miller are the swimmers of the month for April.

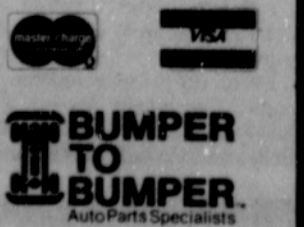

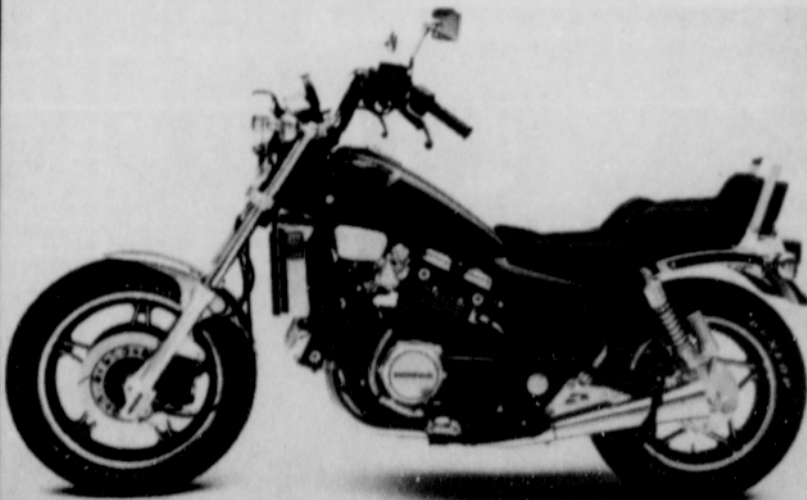
