STEP program to be discussed

The Rhododendron Neighborhood Group will hold a public meeting Saturday, May 15, at 2 p.m. to discuss the Salmon, Trout Enhancement Program (STEP) with a representative from the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Beth Baker, secretary of the RNG, said the meeting will deal with various ways the STEP program will help to improve fish passage and enhancement in Henry and Meadow Creeks.

Recently Jay Massey, a fish biologist with the department's Clackamas County office, conducted a survey of the two streams and identified an ill-placed culvert, which runs underneath Henry Creek Avenue, as being a major obstacle for fish attempting to swim upstream to spawn.

Masey said due to the improperly-placed pipe, fish have to jump three feet out of the water and fight their way up through the

swiftly moving waters flowing through the culvert.

In addition a number of log jams and an old dam would have to be removed in order to insure fish passage during periods of low flow.

Baker said that the department's STEP representative will discuss

improving the stream as well as artificially planting eggs in the creeks in an attempt to increase productivity.

The meeting will be held at Baker's residence at the end of Littlebrook Avenue in Rhododendron.
