Roads in area damaged

Travelers along Mt. Hood National Forest roads this spring and summer might find those roads in poor driving condition.

"Winter storms have caused slides, slumps and deep ruts on many roads—particularly in the Clackamas drainage,"

Transportation Systems Manager Jack Anderson said.

"As the roads become clear of snow, we are finding much more damage than we anticipated," he said. "Most of these roads still can be traveled, although they may be

reduced to one lane in place and be very rough driving."

"As our road crews can assess the damage," Anderson added, "roads will be assigned a priority for maintenance. As crews and equipment become available, roads then will be brought back to standard."

Anderson cautions forest users to check with the local ranger station or supervisor's office in Gresham (667-0511, ext. 241) for current conditions before heading to the forest.

Generally, main travel routes such as Highway 224 are in good shape, but it's many of the older, gravel roads that suffered most damage.

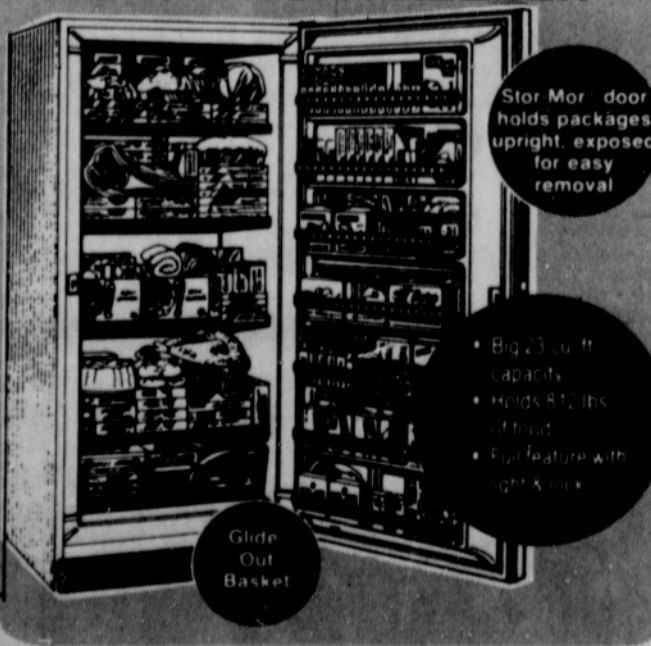
