Students from Welches School earned first- and second-place wins for their efforts in the second annual Red Cross First Aid Festival, held last month at the Lloyd Center in Portland.

The First Aid Festival is a competition held among schools within the five-county area served by the Oregon Trail Chapter of the Red Cross.

Students who participated must have completed Red Cross first aid training on either the Basic Aid Training level, the Standard First Aid level or the Multi-media First Aid level.

Each level has a corresponding degree of difficulty and participants were grouped accordingly in teams for four.

Second in B.A.T. competition was the team coached by Karen Corsini, a fourth grade teacher at Welches. The team, comprised of fourth graders

Registration set for June at MHCC

The summer term at Mt. Hood Community College begins Monday, June 21, with open registration for the more than 400 summer term class sections beginning Tuesday, June 1.

Registration hours in the college's admissions and records office will be 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Fridays from June 1 to June 18. From June 21 through July 29 the admissions office will be open for registration from 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays.

The admissions office will not be open Fridays from June 21 to September 3 due to a four-day, forty-hour week the college is instituting this summer.

The college's Dial-A-Class system will also be available for summer students. Any student registering for eight credit hours or less may use the system by calling 667-7238 June 7 through June 18. The Dial-A-Class hours will be from 1 to 8 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 1 to 3:30 p.m. Fridays during this two-week period.

After June 18, the

telephone registration system will be in operation from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays at 667-7344.

The summer term at MHCC offers a variety of sessions to registering students. The first five-week session begins June 21 and ends July 22. The second five-week session runs from July 26 through August 26. A ten-week session begins June 21 and continues through August 26.

A few concentrated ten-, eleven- and twelve-week sessions will also be offered.

These classes allow the student to complete a year's worth of one academic subject during the summer.

Summer term class schedules are now available from MHCC at both the Gresham campus and the Maywood Park Center. The schedules are also available through the mail by special request.
