## SCP tryouts Sunday for a comedy-thriller

Tryouts for Sandy Community Players' "The Butler Did It" will be this Sunday, May 23, at 2 p.m. at Sandy Community Theater on Proctor Boulevard.

Director Jim Wilhite said roles to be cast include that of a teenage girl or woman in her 20s, a middle-aged lady and men from mid-20s to approximately 65 years of age.

There are two character roles that require little or no previous acting experience and many technical assistance roles to fill also, he said.

"We've very open to new people," Wilhite said, mentioning the earlier success of SCP thespians in discovering new talent in the community. "Try-outs are super open."

Wilhite, a Gresham counselor in his third directing role with SCP, said much experience can be gained simply by trying out for a part in the play.

The comedy-thriller, by Walter and Peter Marks, presents two "firsts" for the local theater group. The first-run play is still running in New York since its June 1981 debut, and Sandy Community Players' production will mark its premiere in the Northwest.

Another new wrinkle with this SCP production, Wilhite said, is an early production schedule that calls for memorization of lines by first rehearsal for more polishing time.

"Amateur theater always has a time problem," he said. "We're going to do this well in advance. Many times the quality of amateur theater can be as good as professional theater, only the cast hasn't spent the time to polish (their production)."

The play will open here Oct. 1 and run four consecutive weekends. Rehearsals begin Aug. 5.

Wilhite's assistant director will be Julie Griffin, a Sandy High School student who cut her teeth on school and SCP parts and plans to major in drama at the University of Washington.

Wilhite credits the local high school for much of the young community theater group's success.

"It's been a breeding ground for artistic excellence for the community," he said. "A number of people now in SCP are products of the Sandy High drama department."

He described "The Butler Did It" as a satire on the recent movie "Deathtrap."

All the characters in "The Butler Did It" happen to be named Butler.

It's actually a play about a play and contains clever twist after twist.
