

## Hodge breaks 3 state records

Eight-year-old Damon Hodge of Sandy broke three Oregon Swimming Association records this weekend with over 500 swimmers participating in the Tualatin Hills Invitational.

Hodge set personal records in every event in which he competed. His state records were in the 50-meter fly, which he swam in 39.29, the 100-meter fly, which he swam in 1:32.18, and the 200-meter individual medley, which he swam in 3:22.77.

He won all three events, as well as the 50-meter breast, which he swam in 49.4.

He was second in the 50 free with a 35.80, second in the 100 free with a 1:21.23, and second in the 50 back with a 46.4.

It was the first long course (50-meter pool) meet of the year.

Gaylord Miller, a first-

year Blue Marlin, also had a good outing. Competing in the age group for 9 and 10 year olds, he achieved Oregon Swimming Association qualifying times in the 50 breast (47.92 for sixth place) and the 100 breast (1:50.48).

Others to place include Michelle Crane in the 9-10 girls division. She was fifth in the 100 fly with a 1:50.34 and sixth in the 50 breast with a 50.22.

Ian Hodge was fourth in the 50 fly with a 40.32 and eighth in the 50 free with a 35.68.

Richard Rolph, 13-14 age group, was fifth in the 800 free with a 10:06.81 and seventh in the 100 back with a 1:13.57.

Dean Haines competed in the "B" division, taking fourth in the 800 free, seventh in the 100 back, third in the 200 back, third in the 100 fly, second in the 200 IM, and sixth in the 200 free.

Steve Bratt, director of skiing at Meadows, is the camp director. He is a former member of the Professional Ski Instructors of America ski team as well as a professional examiner for the Pacific Northwest Ski Instructors Association.
