### Bertina Moore

Bertina Bertha Moore died May 21 at the Portland Adventist Hospital.

Born June 10, 1912 in Tacoma, Wash., she was 69 years of age at her death. She resided in Washington from birth until the early 1940s, when she moved to Boring. She remained a housewife and kept busy with hobbies, such as quilting, cooking, gardening, and garage sales.

She is survived by three sons, Michael, Donald and Gary Clemmer, all of Boring, and her daughter Delores M. Johnson, also of Boring.

### Orval Bennett

Services for retired Sandy High School custodian Orval C. Bennett were held Wednesday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Private burial was at the Scandinavian Cemetery in Sandy.

Mr. Bennett died May 24 in Gresham. He was 67.

He was born in Peace Valley, Mo., on April 4, 1915. Shortly after he began his schooling in Missouri, his family moved to eastern Colorado where he began working in farming.

In 1939, he moved to the Sandy area where he continued working as a farmer.

On Nov. 21, 1941, he married Neva Hauglum. They made their home near Sandy where they raised four children.

Before Mt. Bennett's retirement from Sandy High School in 1980, he had been employed in logging, construction work and farming.

Survivors include his wife, Neva Bennett; four children: Darlene Cannon, Boring; Pat Phillips, Boring; Nona Marshall, Sandy; and Dennis Bennett, Boring; four sisters: Nola Emerick, in Missouri; Evedene Bennett, Albany; Henry and Ivy Bennett, both of Sandy; and seven grandchildren.
