

Horse arena hearing set

A Boring man who wants to put on horse shows and board horses at the old Mt. Hood Stables will ask the Clackamas County hearing officer for an interpretation on his conditional use application next Monday, June 7.

Walter Dorrrough will meet with the hearing officer at 3 p.m. at the Department of Environmental Services, 902 Abernethy Road, Oregon City, to discuss his plans

for the site. He is seeking an interpretation of the determination of the the Clackamas County Planning Division staff that an earlier conditional use permit for a riding stable became invalid when a similar permit was OK'd for General Telephone Company.

At one time, the utility was going to use the facility, on the south side of Highway 26, at its intersection with SE Lariat Lane in Boring, to house its equip-

ment. That plan was later abandoned.

Dorrrough would like a conditional use permit to use the property as a riding stable horse arena, to board horses and hold horse shows.

Up to 190 horses would be boarded on the property.

Approximately 10 horse shows per year would ultimately be held on the property, currently zoned rural residential farm forest, with a five-acre minimum lot size.

Tax on cigarettes jumps

The cost of smoking cigarettes just jumped in Oregon.

Taxes on a pack of smokes took a 3-cent hike Tuesday to a total of 19 cents a pack.

The increase was approved by the 1982 Special Session of the Oregon Legislature as part of a program to balance the state's budget. The increase is in effect until June 30, 1983.

Cigarette tax monies are shared by cities, counties and the state General Fund. Of the existing tax,

cities and counties get 1 cent per pack, with the rest going to state government. All the money generated by the increase—estimated to be \$11.3 million—will go to the state General Fund.

The Oregon Department of Revenue collects the tax. The agency sells tax stamps to cigarette distributors, who sell stamps to retailers.

Distributors and retailers now owe additional tax on stock they purchased earlier, but will

sell now that the increase is in effect. They were required to inventory their stock on hand on their last business day in May and must file special tax returns by June 20.

Revenue agents will make spot checks of distributors and retailers for compliance with the new law.

Cigarette taxes were last increased Dec. 1, 1981. That increase, from 9 cents to 16 cents, was the first since 1972.
