

## Sandy folks to host wrestlers

What does Sandy and West Germany have in common?

Before long they will have both hosted the AAU-sponsored Oregon Cultural Exchange team.

"The Sandy people are just tremendous when it comes to hosting something, and helping out," said Chuck Kearney, one of the coaches.

"Everything seems to be falling into place beautifully."

He's curious to know, first of all, how Oregon's best will do against an Idaho all-star team.

The Idaho team will visit Sandy Wednesday, June 9, for a 6:30 p.m. match at the SUHS gym.

And, the Idaho team has a 178 pounder Kearney hopes will be matched against his son, Chuck Kearney III.

The younger Kearney, a triple crown winner (AAA state, freestyle and Greco-Roman) is only one of a number of talented wrestlers on the team.

He will be joined by 105.5-pound Andre Taylor, 114.5-pound Mike Richey, 123-pound Randy Schimmel, 132-pound Travis Hancock, 143-pound Kelly Edvalson, 154-pound Junior Taylor, 165-pound Lloyd Hygelund, 190-pound Scott Ames and unlimited heavyweight David Maley.

Maley, the 6-5 and 265-pound "silent giant," was one of the top football prospects in the state this year, and has signed a letter of intent to play at UO.

We'll have him wrestling too by the time this is over, Coach Kearney said.

At the local Gordon Stone's store they'll find out just how large Maley is. Gordon Stone's is providing

the blazers, slacks, shirts and specially-designed ties for below cost.

Ray Contreras, a local businessman, is providing Cultural Exchange t-shirts.

In addition, Larry's Sporting Center of Oregon City is providing workout clothes, and Nike is providing running and wrestling shoes.

All that is just a start, as limousine service is being provided to the airport June 10, where the wrestlers will be sent off by the Royal Rosarians.

SUHS teacher Ruth Sherman and some of her students will be teaching a special German culture and functional speaking class.

Bruce Scarth, SUHS music teacher, has agreed to teach the wrestlers a couple of songs, including, hopefully, a country-western song in German.

The wrestlers will train in Chicago for four days, wrestling teams from other states, including Oklahoma.

Coach Kearney is of course anxious to see how Oregon matches up with other states.

Once in West Germany the team will tour, and compete against all-star teams and clubs.

They'll stay with host families, probably with the parents of wrestlers they have or will compete against.

The elder Kearney figures they'll stay in two different homes per week.

The tour has been set up by AAU, which sponsors a number of wrestling exchanges and is run by a former Oregonian.

The tour will end with a tournament where at least six other European countries will compete.
