

# Music's influence examined

McGregor works with young people on a daily basis through his ministry at the church and meeting with students at Sandy High School.

He talks with them about problems of escalating concern to teen-agers—alcohol, drugs and suicide.

"I get with the program," he said. "I don't pull back many punches. In three years in Sandy, not every young person has heard what I've shared. Even if they don't accept my message, they've accepted me."

"Young people are not dummies and they know if you're sincere or not."

The response his messages on music, as witnessed by the destroyed albums and standing-room-only crowd last Sunday, testify that someone is listening.

"We've spent many hours preparing these messages. We felt there was a strong need so we put in the time," he said.

McGregor used outside resources who have studied Satanic and occult messages in music on a full-time basis to speed up the process of his own preparation.

"They gave us some clues as to where to start."

For this Sunday's presentation, he went to the literature of the rock'n'roll world—magazines like "Circus" and "Rolling Stone."

## LIFESTYLES UNSETTLING

Sunday, McGregor plans to deal with the lifestyles of the musicians who make the music.

He noted that the band Van Halen did \$12,000 damage to a dressing room at UCLA because brown M&Ms were mixed in with their candy, against contract stipulations.

Gene Simmons of KISS has spoken of his curiosity about the taste of human flesh and Ozzy Osbourne bit the head off a bat during a concert.

What of those who haven't chosen to accept the message of Satanic subliminal induction: rock'n'roll?

"Personally, I think the evidence has been conclusive enough that it's not that they don't believe us," he said, "but that they don't want to accept a change."

What then is the alternative?

"They don't want country-western; they don't want

Beethoven," he said. In three weeks McGregor plans a service that will introduce contemporary gospel music to the younger audience.

The Bible pointed out that Satan will make an attempt to take over, he noted, "then we see it coming to pass in rock'n'roll music."

"Satan knows he only has a short time. Music is the tool of the masses and he's using it to full potential," McGregor said.

AC-DC, an Australian band, typifies the backward masking effects of Satan and the burning message of

Christianity McGregor is trying to share in his message to youth.

On "Highway to Hell," the band sings, "I'm going to party all the way to hell."

"Well, AC-DC and many more have a big surprise," McGregor said.

"As we said Sunday and will share again this week, 'Eternity's a long time.' Eternal life can be spent with God, instead of hell. That's the message we're trying to get across."
