Truck Lines 4-4 after 19-14 win

Sandy Truck Lines got a 19-14 win over Troutdale Monday night in Midget American League baseball action.

Jacob Iverson takes the win, and he pitched his best game of the season, according to Coach Glenn Abbott.

He struck out four, and gave up six runs on three hits, and three bases-on-balls, in three innings.

He was relieved by Adam Cannon, who had his

poorest outing of the season, according to Abbott.

The Sandy players had their best night at the plate so far, getting 10 hits.

They were led by Kent Taylor, who went three-for-four, Cannon, who was two-for-four (with one triple), Mike Burns, who was two-for-four (one double), and Brian Cox, who was two-for-four.

Iverson and Travis Hilstad also hit singles.

The game was close until the fourth inning. Jeff Thompson walked, and Hilstad laid down a "beautiful" bunt on the third-base line. Kent Taylor singled for an RBI. Tony Kolwit walked, and Cannon got on on an error. Iverson and Cox then stroked singles for a total of five runs.

Truck Line fell 7-6 to Rockwood "B" in another recent Midget American game.

Hilstad started and takes the loss. He struck out four but walked eight. Several of Sandy's errors occurred when he was on the mound.

Cannon "pitched another outstanding game" in relief, striking out seven, giving up one hit, walking three but allowing no runs. Hilstad pitched two and one-third innings while Cannon pitched two and two-thirds.

Sandy was doing a good job of hitting the ball, according to Abbott, though it seemed that most of the balls were hit directly to

fielders. Singles were hit by Cannon, Mark Trost, Danny Copher and Burns.

Rockwood's pitching was good, reports Abbott. Rockwood's pitchers gave up four hits and four bases-on-balls while striking out four. They also benefitted from two double plays.

Sandy is currently 4-4 overall, 3-2 in league.

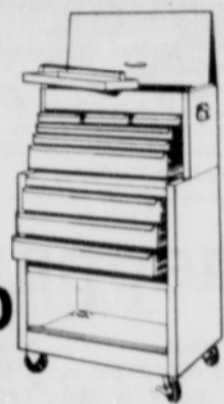

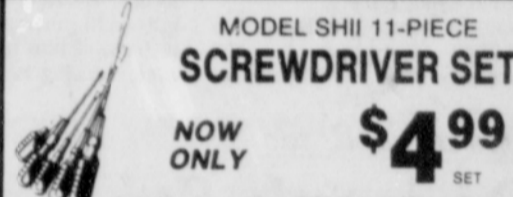

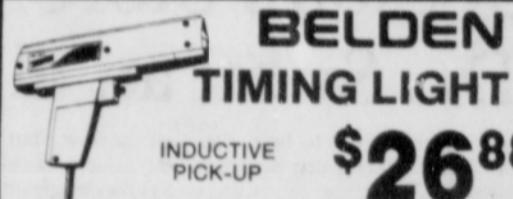
