

# Portland fire costs couple \$2,500

A Brightwood couple lost \$2,500 in merchandise when the Rainbow Flea Market, S.E. 78th and Foster Road in Portland, burned early Saturday morning.

Bob Marshall and his wife, Anita, are regulars on the small market circuit. Marshall makes and sells

jewelry, while Anita makes and sells crocheted and knitted items.

One estimate put the content damages of the Rainbow Flea Market at \$40,000, according to Marshall, but he feels that estimate was low in a couple of ways.

I know four people who

each had at least \$10,000 in losses, Marshall said.

A monetary value doesn't tell the complete story anyway. "There were people's lives in there. That's all they did," Marshall said.

Marshall lost \$500 in cut turquoise stones alone, and

his wife had clothing destroyed that she'd been working on from as far back as November.

Marshall drove a bus during the school year for Sandy Union High School. He said he was depending on sales from markets to make ends meet. Now he's looking for work, but has found the prospects to be far from encouraging.
