Wrestlers ready for roll in the mud

Four local women will give mud wrestling a try during intermission at the Yamaha Gold Cup motorcycle races this Sunday at Mt. View Raceways, 38960 S.E. Rude Road. Last year 387 riders (123 professionals) participated in the Gold Cup races. The professionals will begin warm-ups at 11 a.m., and will compete for \$3,000 in prize money. Intermission is at 2 p.m. This year, as far as entertainment value, the guys might have a har! time competing with the ladies.

At the four-wheel drive races a

few weeks ago Ron Long, Mt. View Raceways owner, asked Gail Freeman, an employee at Toni's Restaurant and Lounge and a six-year resident of Sandy, if she'd like to go out and do some mud wrestling. She declined at the time, but agreed to try to get some locals involved and set up some matches. Two three-minute matches will be wrestled Sunday. Winners will wrestle a second time with the winner of that match getting \$50. Applause will determine the winner of each match. In addition there will be an auction, with the high bidder (a man) getting to wrestle two of the

women. He will wear boxing gloves. Although the auction money goes to the women wrestlers, Freeman said, "We're doing it more for kicks." "Hopefully a lot of people from Toni's will be there to back us up," Freeman added. Alice Markwell, who has lived in the area seven years, pointed out the event will be "real clean, except for the mud." They plan to wear shorts and a T-shirt or one-piece swimming suits and a T-shirt. "I think it'll be fun," Markwell said. "It'll be interesting anyway.

It'll be an experience you won't forget." She paused a moment, then added, "I won't." Sue Sorrels, who has lived in the area six years and works at the Sandy Fotomat, said she is looking forward to the matches. "It ought to be entertaining," she said, admitting that she knows "absolutely nothing about wrestling." Darlene Humbird, a 13-year resident of the area, also said she looks forward to giving mud wrestling a try. "I don't care if I win or lose, I just want to get out there in the mud," she said.

The story of the Kung culture is a fascinating glimpse into a world slowly being absorbed into the 21st century and a heartwarming story of a woman equal to any.
