

Investigation into arson fire continues

The Oregon State Police arson squad and Sandy Fire District investigation into a fire east of Sandy last Tuesday evening continues.

According to Sandy Fire Marshal Jim Gallagher, the study has come up with some leads and clues.

The blaze, reported at 9:48 p.m., destroyed an 800-square-foot shed at 43828 SE Highway 26. It was owned by Dr. William E. Rippey of Portland. Value on the gutted building was placed at approximately \$2,000.

Earlier last Tuesday evening, Sandy emergency medical personnel responded to a one-car accident on Highway 211 at Tickle Creek. The injured parties were taken to the hospital by private vehicles.

A chimney fire Friday afternoon on Serban Road did no damage, according to Gallagher.

Later, at 8 p.m. firefighters responded to a fire in a dumpster at Firwood School. The fire was caused by hot ashes which were placed in the dumpster after the school's incinerator was cleaned, Gallagher said.

The spring residential backyard burning season ended Tuesday. The season started March 1.

Burning will still be permitted under an agricultural burning permit, however, on acceptable burning days.

To qualify for an agricultural burning permit, a resident must raise something for sale on their property. These permits are available at no charge

at the Sandy Fire Department.

The fire department also has daily advisories for burning days.

The Commission is expected to review a staff analysis of backyard burning detailing the air quality impact and availability of alternative disposal methods to the start of the fall burning season on Oct. 1.
