With mobile unit

Health screenings planned

Citizens of the Sandy area will have an opportunity to get a free health update July 11 as a community service of the Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church.

A mobile health unit will be at Williams Thriftway, 17450 Meinig Ave., from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. to provide free blood pressure, pulmonary function and diabetes screening. Computer self-practices of longevity are also available.

Linda Chancellor, Community Health coordinator, commenting on the health

van's visit to Sandy, said, "Many people have health problems that they are not aware of and which need attention."

"All of the testing is done by qualified personnel," she added. "When individuals being tested have conditions which need medical attention, they are advised to see their family physician immediately."

The Portland-based unit was purchased in 1975 at a cost of \$11,000 by the Oregon Conference of the church for health testing in Oregon and southern Washington.

"We are fortunate to have the unit in our area because there is a heavy demand for its use," said Sandy Pastor Bernell Clark. "Modern health techniques make it possible to treat most illnesses successfully, if detected early."

"We believe that man can serve his God more effectively when he is healthy and strong," he said.

The mobile unit is equipped with a machine that gives an automatic readout on blood pressure. Instruments are also available for checking

pulmonary functions.

The vital capacity of the lungs is measured, as well as the ability of the lungs to force out the air they contain.

A free, computerized health profile is offered to everyone who is referred to the mobile unit. Depending on the individual's answers to a health questionnaire, the computer will predict his remaining length of life.

It is based on averages from a study of nearly 4,000 people. The computer printout also suggests ways an individual may increase his life expectancy.
