

Sandy girls first in Pigtail Tournament

Sandy took first in the Welches Girls Pigtail Tournament last weekend, beating an undefeated Tri-County Pigtail League opponent to do it.

The top two teams in each division of the league were eligible to compete in the four-team tournament for 8- to 10-year-old girls. Sandy first beat undefeated Lynch, 21-20, and then top-

Copher was credited with pitching well in his first outing since the first of the season.

Adam Cannon led the way offensively, hitting two home runs and one single in three at-bats, driving in five RBIs.

Everyone got hits, with Kent Taylor, Mark Trost and Copher each hitting

triples. Rockwood "A" was undefeated at 16-0 (10-0 in league) going into the game. The game was tied at the end of regulation play, but Rockwood won in an extra inning.

There were only two hits in the game, both by Rockwood, but walks, wild pitches, errors and passed balls accounted for all the runs.

Cannon went the distance for Sandy and takes the loss. He's now 2-1.

Coach Glenn Abbott credited the Sandy boys for playing hard until the last out, and reportedly Sandy gave Rockwood its toughest game yet.

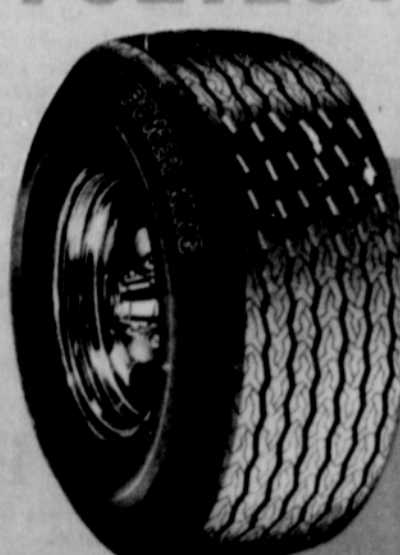

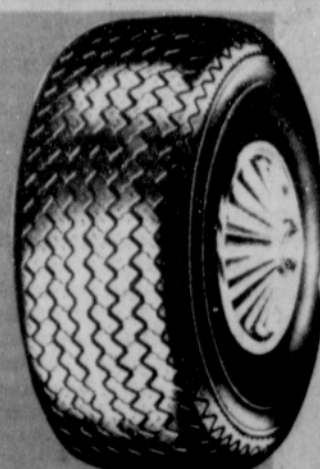
