Jehovah's Witnesses set to convene

Some 900 delegates representing Sandy and Gresham will attend one of 104 Jehovah's Witnesses conventions scheduled in 68 cities in the United States during the summer of 1982.

Arnold Anderson, spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses, said approximately 1 million persons are expected nationwide at the "Kingdom Truth" conventions, adding that all Oregon, southwest Washington, western Idaho and northern California members will attend one of three conventions in Corvallis.

"The outlook is dismal in the world today," Anderson said. "Many people question whether mankind can survive in view of the complex problems threatening us."

He stressed that only divine intervention can provide a solution to the crises facing mankind and the increasing peril of nuclear war. "Many people fail to see that God's kingdom is a real government," Anderson said. "But the well-known 'Lord's Prayer' makes it clear that our hope and faith should be anchored in God's kingdom. That is why we pray for it to come."
