

## Surplus cheese to be distributed

There is more free cheese on the way, courtesy of the U.S. government.

Qualifying families in Sandy, Boring and the Mount Hood area can get a five-pound block of cheese from the federal government if they meet income qualifications.

To qualify for the cheese, recipients must have an income that doesn't exceed 125 percent of the government's official poverty income guideline.

A family of four with a gross monthly income of \$950 would be eligible for the cheese, however, a similar family earning \$1,000 a

month would not qualify.

U.S. Department of Agriculture surplus cheese will be distributed at several sites in around the county next week.

Sandy area residents with a ZIP code of 97055, 97030 or 97019 may pick up the cheese at the Sandy Community Action Center, 38500 Pioneer Blvd., any day next week, July 19 to 23. Distribution hours will be 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m.

Boring residents who have a Boring Post Office ZIP code, 97009, may pick up cheese from 3 to 6 p.m. July 20 and 21 at the Boring

School District's Naas Building, 12240 SE School Ave.

Boring residents who have a Gresham Post Office ZIP code, 97030, can claim some of the free cheese at the Sandy Community Action Center.

Hoodland area residents with ZIP codes of 97011, 97028, 97049 or 97067 may pick up the cheese at the Mt. Hood Lions Club in Wemme next Thursday between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The giveaway is for Clackamas County residents only. Proof of address will be required.

## November election set for council

The city of Sandy is looking for residents who want to help shape the city's future during the next four years.

Local voters will vote Nov. 2 for three City Council members and a mayor. On the same ballot, the city expects to present a tax base proposal that would replace its current \$14,000 limit.

City Manager Roger Jordan said this week that people interested in seeking a spot on the city's governing board should be ready now to begin the process that will lead to the November election.

The council members will serve four-year terms,

while the mayor serves a two-year term.

Incumbent Mayor Ruth Loundree said Tuesday that she has not yet made a final determination as to whether or not she will seek a third term.

Council members whose terms will expire in November are Don Blair, Vern Richards and Deane Wesselink.

This year all nominating petitions for the elected positions must be filed with the city no later than 5 p.m. on Aug. 31. This will allow the city a small amount of time to verify the signatures gathered.

The city charter specifies that anyone who wishes to

run for a city office must obtain a petition at City Hall and obtain a minimum of 20 valid voters' signatures from residents within the city. The petition must be filed with the city recorder.

If the petition has been circulated by someone other than the person being nominated, the nominated persons must also file an acceptance of the nomination.

No voter may sign more than one petition for each office to be filled in the election. That means a resident may sign three council petitions and one

mayoral petition.

Jordan recommended that anyone who is seeking election should file their petition as early as possible so that city officials can verify the signatures. If signatures cannot be verified and the petition has been filed early enough, the candidate can be notified that deficiencies are evident and the appropriate corrections may be made before the final filing date.

If a petition is filed with an insufficient number of registered voters who live in the city, the name on the petition cannot be placed on the ballot.

## Bowman's management revamped
