Funeral services set for Sandy residents

Funeral Mass for Stephen Nicholls will be held Monday, July 19, at 10 a.m. at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Sandy. Recitation of the Rosary will be Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. at the church.

Mr. Nicholls, program director for Catholic Relief Services, died July 7 from injuries suffered when he was struck by a vehicle in the Arab Republic of Yemen. He was 32.

The son of Dale and Doris Nicholls of Sandy, he was born July 30, 1949 in Los Angeles, Calif. He was raised in California and graduated from Palmdale High School in 1967.

After his graduation, he moved to Oregon with his family to make their home in Sandy. That fall, Mr. Nicholls enrolled at Portland State University where he studied history, political science and journalism.

After graduation in 1971, he worked at the Oregon Journal while continuing studies toward a master's degree.

Prompted by his humanitarian concerns, Mr. Nicholls joined Catholic Relief Services (CRS), a private non-profit organization which helps the world's poor, in 1974.

While serving in Cambodia with CRS he helped build three refugee camps that were among the first for the Cambodian people.

He was there for eight months as assistant director before CRS pulled out because Cambodian soldiers were not allowing CRS supplies to reach the civilian population.

Mr. Nicholls was then sent to Egypt for three years as assistant director. While there, he helped build the Egyptian program from \$2 million to \$28 million per year.

He returned to Oregon after three years to work on his master's degree in history from PSU.

For the past two years, he served as program director in Yemen. While working in Yemen, he became acquainted with Nobel Prize winner Mother Teresa and her dedication to helping the very poor with her Sisters of Charity.

During a visit to Sandy in 1980, Mr. Nicholls told The Post of his experiences, "I don't get rich at it, but it's fun."

In lieu of flowers, the

family suggests donations be made to St. Michael's Catholic Church at P.O. Box 548, Sandy, OR 97055, with a notation for Steve Nicholls Memorial Fund. All donations will be forwarded to Mother Teresa's Sisters of Charity.

Mr. Nicholls is survived by his parents, Dale and Doris Nicholls of Sandy; four sisters, Marilyn Matthews in Arizona, Beverly Manzo in California and Janice Rockwell and Catherine Trimble, both of Sandy; three brothers, William in California, James of Sandy and Donald of Carver.

Sandy Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

Harry Pinewski

At the family's request, there was no funeral service for Harry Anton Pinewski of Eagle Creek who died July 7 at Gresham Community Hospital. He was 69.

A memorial service was held Saturday in the Gresham City Park.

Born June 12, 1913 in Greenbush, Minn., he moved to Aberdeen, Wash., in 1942. Subsequently, he moved to Portland in 1949, to Sandy in 1961 and Forest Grove in 1964. After returning to Portland and living in Vancouver, Wash., he settled in Eagle Creek in 1968.

He married Jeanette Phillips in Portland in 1950. They divorced in 1965.

Mr. Pinewski enjoyed the outdoors and worked for many years in the lumber industry, owning and operating sawmills. He also enjoyed woodworking and made many household pieces of furniture.

He is survived by two sons, Jerry Pinewski and Jim Phillips, both of Aberdeen; four daughters, Anna Dean of Tacoma, Wash., Audrey Frazier of West Minister, Calif., Barbara Smith of Umatilla and Katherine Dailey of Nashville, Tenn.; three brothers; four sisters, and 12 grandchildren.

Lola Castle

Funeral services for Lola Elaine Castle of Sandy were held Tuesday in the chapel of Carroll Funeral Home in Gresham. She died July 10 at a local nursing home. She was 82.

Born April 23, 1900 in Keutherville, Idaho, she moved to southern Oregon when she was 3 years old.

She attended schools at Medford, Ashland and Cottage Grove.

She moved to Portland when she was 24 and worked at Northwest Bell. She married Roy Castle in Vancouver, Wash., on Nov. 25, 1925. They moved to Sandy in 1956. Mr. Castle died in 1973.

Mrs. Castle enjoyed tobogganing and horseshoes, and pitched on the telephone company's softball team for a number of years.

Mrs. Castle was a member of the Baptist Church. She had been in failing health for the past year.

She is survived by two sons, Donald of Sandy and Dale of Portland; 10 grandchildren, and 11 great-grandchildren. Mrs. Castle was the last member of her own family.

Interment was at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Gresham.

James Howard

Funeral services for former Sandy resident James Marlowe Howard were held Monday at Bateman's Funeral Home in Newport. He died July 8 in a Newport hospital. He was 65.

Born in Leadville, Colo., he had been a resident of South Beach for the past four years. Prior to that he lived in Sandy and Wemme where he worked in construction and maintenance in the Mount Hood National Forest for the U.S. Forest Service for 12 years. He retired in 1977.

He served in the U.S. Army during World War II.

He is survived by wife Genevieve of South Beach; a daughter, Catherine Kenney of Siletz; two sons, Wayne Wyman of Siletz and Raymond Lee of Eugene, and one grandchild.

Burial was at Eureka Cemetery in Newport.
