Funeral services will be held today, Aug. 5, at 1:30 p.m. at Sandy Funeral Home for Sandy resident Clara E. Barton.

**Alvin Smothers**

Funeral services for Alvin Smothers of Sandy will be held today, Aug. 5, at 10:30 a.m. at the Bateman Funeral Chapel in Gresham.

Mr. Smothers was born November 9, 1934. He died Aug. 1 at his home in Sandy.

He was raised in Nebraska where he attended schools. He enlisted in the Navy in 1952. After his discharge in 1955 he moved to Portland where he lived until 1974 when he moved to the Boring and later Sandy area.

He married Charmaine Morris on Oct. 11, 1967 in Los Angeles. She died in 1978. He worked for 25 years for the H.A. Anderson Construction Co.

He was a member of the Rose City Yacht Club, Portland Scuba Club and Sea Lions Club.

He is survived by his children, Terry of Lemore, Calif., Elaine Bigelow and Jimmy Smothers, both of Sandy; a brother, James of Texas; a sister, Jeannine Crooks of Minnesota, and one grandchild.

**Boring woman sentenced**

A Boring woman received five years probation last week after pleading guilty to criminally negligent homicide in the death of a Clackamas County Sheriff's deputy.

Gay L. May, 20, confessed on April 30 that she was responsible for the death of Deputy Jimmy L. Shoop, 35, of Rockwood. May pulled in front of Shoop's patrol car at the intersection of SE Orient Drive and Kelso Road last Nov. 7 at about 3 a.m., while the deputy was on his way to another fatal

traffic accident. Clackamas County Circuit Judge Dale Jacobs gave May the probation and ordered her to perform 200 hours of community service last Wednesday. He indefinitely postponed imposing any prison term in connection with the accident.

Criminally negligent homicide is a class C felony which carries a maximum sentence of five years in prison and a fine of up to \$100,000.

May had faced second-

degree manslaughter and drunk driving charges, but agreed to the lesser charge of negligent homicide through plea bargaining. She also will be evaluated for alcohol-abuse problems by court order and, if necessary, will enroll in a program for alcoholics.

The county is asking May to pay Shoop's burial costs and pay for the damage to the patrol car. She will appear at a restitution hearing Sept. 22, according to the district attorney's office.

**Candidates kick off fall campaign**

Area candidates for jobs in the state capital aren't waiting for the traditional Labor Day kick-off to launch their fall campaigns for the November General Election.

Steve Starkovich, joined by a bipartisan group of local city and county officials, will hold a reception for Seattle Mayor Charles Royer, first vice president of the National League of Cities.

Starkovich is the Democratic nominee for the Oregon State Senate from District 14.

Democratic candidate for state representative Bob Shiprack kicks off his general election campaign this Tuesday, Aug. 10, with an open house at 6 p.m.

Starkovich's reception for Royer will be held Thursday, Aug. 12, at

1529 SW 12th in Portland, at 5:30 p.m.

The Senate District, known as the "helicopter district," extends from rural Clackamas County to east Lane County.

Starkovich noted that his priorities for the small cities and towns in District 14 include preservation of strong home rule for local municipalities, reduction in mandated costs to cities and towns from state government, and close intergovernmental cooperation on economic development programs.

Charles Royer was first elected mayor of Seattle in November 1977—his first bid for elective office. As an officer of the National League of Cities he is concerned

with the plight of American cities, large and small.

Shiprack, who is seeking the seat in House District 23, lists more jobs for Oregonians, an equitable tax system and sensible growth and zoning laws with local control and input among his priorities.

He graduated from Portland State University with a bachelor's degree in social science. He is an electrician and has been involved in local government.

Shiprack plans an informal evening Tuesday with food served at 6 p.m., followed by a 7 p.m. meeting.
