

# High school sets registration times

School bells will toll soon and Sandy Union High School officials are readying for the day when students return from summer vacation.

To prepare for the new school year, registration and scheduling dates have been set for new and returning students.

According to Dick Harrison, director of student services, all incoming and returning students will receive a schedule and instructions in the mail. If that schedule is acceptable, a student will only need to sign the schedule and register.

Registration gets underway next Wednesday, Aug. 18, for freshmen and new students from noon to 8 p.m. Sophomores, juniors and seniors with no schedule changes may confirm their schedules and register Thursday and Friday, Aug. 19 and 20.

Thursday's session will be noon to 8 p.m.; Friday, registration will be 8 a.m.

to 3:30 p.m. During registration, fees will be paid, lockers will be assigned and turnout cards for activities and athletics will be completed. Counselors will be present to answer students' questions.

Arena scheduling for seniors will be Aug. 30 from 9 a.m. to noon; juniors will schedule their classes that day from 1 to 4 p.m.; Sophomores will plan their schedules Aug. 31 from 9

a.m. to noon and freshmen will meet that afternoon from 1 to 4 p.m.

Students will complete their class schedules during those time periods and are asked to report promptly. Parents are also welcome during the scheduling process.

Schedules will be completed during arena and will be official. Students will not be allowed to change their schedule after

their scheduled arena time is completed.

No buses will run during registration or scheduling.

Students who don't attend their scheduled arena time may go to the school Sept. 8 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. to enroll in classes that are still available for their grade level. By going late, however, the student will lose the opportunity of first choice and a preferred schedule, according to

school officials.

Buses will run their regular schedules on the first day of school for freshmen, Sept. 7. Classes will be held all day for freshmen only as an orientation. Selected student body officers and honor roll students will be present to act as guides and lend a helping hand.

The rest of the student body will begin school Sept. 8 with a full day of classes.

## Library shut-down delayed

The closure of Sandy Public Library to link up with a countywide library computer system has been delayed.

According to Librarian Sue Newlands, the delay was caused the failure of some needed equipment to arrive from the vendor at the county library head-

quarters. As a result, the closure has been postponed until sometime in September.

She said the moratorium on fines, which was instituted to gain delinquent books for entry into the computer, continues through this Tuesday, Aug. 17.

Newlands said the library is seeking volunteers to assist librarians during the shut-down. The only requirement is that volunteers have accurate typing skills, she said.

"It's really not that difficult," Newlands said.

Volunteers will help type titles in the library's collection into the new computer system for access at other libraries in the countywide system.
