## Woman receives award

Sandy resident Bonnie Baird has been awarded a partial scholarship which will go toward her attendance at the 8th North American Conference on Adoptable Children. The four-day conference will be held at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City Aug. 27-30. Baird received the scholarship from the Region I Adoption Resource Center, and will be representing the Oregon chapter of Organized United Response, a national group founded to encourage the adoption of

children and act as a support system for adoptive families. The Oregon OURS chapter is available to lend material aid to agencies, and people, in need. The group acts as child advocates and also provides material and financial assistance to children from overseas. The conference, "Meeting Children's Needs...So Alike...So Different," boasts U.S. Senator Daniel Moynihan as honorary chairman and the Rev. George Clements as keynote speaker.

Baird is an adoptive parent of a two-year-old daughter from India and past vice president of the Oregon chapter of OURS. Baird teaches pre-adoptive classes for the PLAN adoption agency in McMinnville. Through her attendance at the conference Baird will be in a position to further study adoption and welfare legislation and bring back valuable information for prospective adoptive parents.
