

New teachers hired at area schools

Four of the six school districts in the Sandy area will be hiring new teachers

for the coming school year. One district has also hired a new superintendent.

Nancy Savage, a former second grade teacher who left Welches Grade School

two years ago to raise a family, is returning for the 1982-83 school year.

According to Superintendent Kenneth Blackburn, Savage has been re-hired by

the Welches School District as a full-time fourth grade teacher.

Savage returned to Welches last year and worked under an extended

substitute teacher's contract as a physical education instructor.

The Sandy Elementary District will have four new teachers. However, to date only two of these positions have been filled.

Superintendent Clark Lund said the position for a language arts teacher and a guidance and counseling position for seventh and eighth graders at Cedar Ridge School have not been filled.

Lund said he anticipates the positions being filled by the first of September at the latest.

The two positions the district has filled are both at Sandy Elementary, said Lund.

Pamela Beasley has been hired to operate the resource classroom for special education.

Beasley, said Lund, is not a newcomer to the district. Last year she worked under a special extended contract.

Connie Kinder has been hired as a sixth grade teacher at Sandy Elementary.

At Cottrell, there is an opening for a part-time teacher in the talented and gifted program, as well as for a resource room (Title I-handicapped) instructor.

It's expected that both positions will be filled soon.

The Bull Run School District has hired two new teachers for the coming school year, in addition to a new superintendent.

Wesley John was hired in July as the superintendent for the Bull Run District. He is a former from Eagle Point, Ore., which is 15 miles northeast of Medford. He served that district as superintendent for four years.

Kathleen Anthony, a recent graduate of Portland State University, has been hired as the district's first and second grade teacher.

Ralph Wanderer has been hired as the district's seventh and eighth grade teacher. Last year he taught at Round Valley Elementary School in Covelo, Calif.

The Sandy Union High School and Boring Elementary Districts will be hiring no new teachers.
