

Local fair winners announced

An all-time attendance record was established at the Clackamas County Fair with a total of 117,469 going through the gates during the six-day event.

Supporters of the Junior Livestock Auction apparently haven't heard of the recession, as previous records were shattered, both in cash volume and in individual auction prices paid.

A total of \$90,557.29 was raised from the sale of 191 animals, compared to the \$85,695.20 realized last year from the sale of 228 animals.

The auction has been a strong incentive for youthful livestock raisers in Clackamas County and has helped many of them further their education or add to their livestock herds, said Charles Marsh, manager of the annual event.

Twenty-nine fleeces were exhibited at this year's county fair. Trevor Stortie of Boring received a blue ribbon in wool crossbred.

More than 80 goats were represented in dairy goat competition. In the toggenburg 2-year-old milker division, Ruth Roney of Sandy received a blue ribbon.

Tom Roney of Sandy had the grand champion and champion toggenburg milking u.e. 3 to 5 years.

In goat showmanship, Ruth Roney of Sandy received a red ribbon in the dairy goat juniors (novice) division.

Tom Roney of Sandy received a red ribbon in dairy goat intermediate showmanship.

Wens honored on 100th birthday

Matilda Wens, a resident at St. Jude's Home, was 100 years old on Aug. 26.

A birthday party was held in her honor. Wens was born in Dusseldorf, Germany, in

1882. Her parents moved to the United States when she was 6 months old. The family settled in

Philadelphia for about 15 years, and then moved to Nebraska, where Wens met and married Herman John Wens, in 1900.

Three sons were born in Nebraska, including John, who also lives at St. Jude's Home.

In 1915 the Wens homesteaded 320 acres in Wyoming.

They also lived in South Dakota before moving to Oregon. They lived in Scappoose and Eagle Creek, and finally settled in Rainier, Wash.

After her husband died she continued to live in Rainier until 1960, when she and John moved to Gresham. She moved into St. Jude's in 1974.

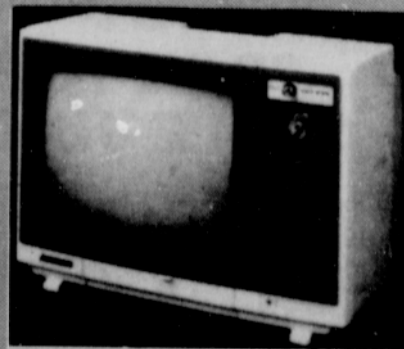
