Curtain raises for senior actors

A class which will fling open new vistas for older adults is scheduled this fall.

Sandy and Gresham area senior citizens will have the opportunity to explore Drama for Seniors. It is an introductory class, designed specifically to enliven and enrich the lives of older adults.

The class will be taught by Bonnie L. Vorenberg, a professional in theater, dance and gerontology. She serves on the Portland/Multnomah Commission on Aging, on the American Theatre Association's National Senior Adult Theatre Program and is currently project director for an Arts and Aging grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

Her goal is to keep senior adults young, fresh and adaptable to change.

Because Vorenberg believes "anyone of any age can act," she teaches an energizing Drama for Seniors basic acting class. It explores speaking, listening, emotions and characters to discover how they contribute to the basics of drama.

Participants find theater to be a healthy stimulation for mind, body and emotions, but most of all acting is fun, she said.

Seniors with any level of experience are welcome. The class, sponsored by the Sandy and Gresham Senior Centers and Mount Hood Community College, will be held at the Sandy Senior Center, 38348 Pioneer Blvd., on Fridays from 10 a.m. to noon, beginning Oct. 1.

Watermelon theft nets trip to jail

A 12-year-old Sandy youth was arrested early Friday morning after residents along McCormick Drive told police that someone was attempting to break into their vehicles parked along the street.

The youth was arrested at 1:04 a.m. and charged with eight counts of attempted theft, one count of attempted burglary and one count of second-degree theft.

He was released to his parents and referred to Clackamas County juvenile authorities.

Dennis Frank LaFrienier, 21, was taken to Clackamas County Jail on a charges of second-degree theft, giving a false name to a police officer and a Multnomah County warrant for driving with a suspended license.

Last Tuesday evening, George LeRoy Connert, 32, of Sandy was charged with wreckless driving, driving under the influence of intoxicants and failure to furnish proof of insurance after the car he was driving rolled on North Bluff Road near Bell Street.
