## City plans more youth activities

More activities for youngsters are on the Sandy Recreation Department's fall calendar than ever before.

"We're trying to emphasize a lot more kids' stuff," said recreation director Bill Knight-Weiler, "particularly little kids' stuff."

The regular line-up of fall activities will be augmented with a toy library, classes on puppeteering and a Harvest Moon Treasure Hunt.

The toy library, which works like a regular library, has been successful elsewhere in the state and Sandy's should follow suit, if a catalog of toys can be established, Knight-Weiler said.

"Some of the towns on the Coast are doing it," he said. "Hopefully people will bring in their toys at our first meeting." Currently, he said, a couple softballs are all that make up the inventory.

The puppeteering class will offer youngsters an opportunity to make their own puppets and put on a program for the community.

The treasure hunt will coincide with traditional harvest festivities.

"We thought we'd get the kids out on the night of the full moon—the harvest moon, actually," Knight-Weiler said. Following a set of clues, they will hunt for prizes which will be hidden around Meinig Park.

All the new offerings won't just be for the young, however. Some will be for the young at heart.

The recreation department will offer Friday night performances at the Sandy Community Center.

"It's a takeoff on your typical coffee house where people in the community can come in and play music," he said.

Here is a sampling of the fall line-up:

**Friday Night Performances:** Alternate Friday evenings upstairs in the Sandy Community Center, beginning Oct. 15, from 7:30 to 10 p.m., instrumentalists, bands and people who like to make music for fun will gather to entertain the community.

Anyone interested in performing is asked to contact the Sandy Recreation Department, 668-5569, to reserve a date for their performance. Coffee and refreshments will be served.

**Pre-School Co-op:** A variety of fun and educational activities will be offered for children, ages 3 to 5, including crafts, storytelling, field trips and games. Parent participation will be required on a rotating basis.

An organizational meeting will be held Thursday, Sept. 23, at 10 a.m. at the Sandy Community Center. Costs will be determined by the group.

**Puppeteering:** Children will learn how to make different puppets and perform a show. Time and place for this activity will be announced. A materials fee will be charged.

**Introduction to Theater for Youth:** This activity will be for 8- to 12-year-olds. Times and places will be announced.

**Dungeons and Dragons:** E.T. was only the beginning. Monday afternoons at the Sandy Community Center, aficionados of this medieval game—and newcomers too—will gather from 3 to 5 p.m. The activity begins Oct. 4 and is free.

**Community Card Night:** Begins Oct. 8 at 7:30 p.m. at the Sandy Community Center.

**Toy Library:** This new idea in lending libraries is patterned after similar libraries in other Oregon communities. An organizational meeting will be held Wednesday, Oct. 6, at 10 a.m. at the Sandy Community Center.

**Beginning Bookbinding:** Learn the ancient art of bookbinding in this two-day workshop. Each student will complete a hand-bound book. Class runs Nov. 17 and 18, 6:30-9:30 p.m. at the Sandy Community Center. There is a \$5 charge, plus a materials fee.

**Harvest Moon Treasure Hunt:** Some very unusual objects have been hidden somewhere in the city park. Different clues have been drawn up for different age groups.


