

Pioneers face 1-1 David Douglas

It was an evening of big plays for the Bruins. A 33-yard reverse set up a one-yard plunge by fullback Dave Jarrett. Jim Snowadski's kick was good for a 7-0 first quarter lead.

Chuck Kearney's 33-yard run got Sandy in a position to match Barlow's TD, but a fumble (which Sandy recovered), a three-yard gain, and two incomplete passes (though not in that order) ended the series.

The Pioneers stayed in Barlow territory when the Bruins fumbled on their first possession, with senior Todd Byron recovering.

The Pioneers got down to the nine-yard line, but sophomore Brent Kearney's 19-yard field goal attempt on the fourth down was no good. Barlow had a 7-0 halftime lead.

In the third quarter a 50-yard run by Barlow's Bill Fellows set up a four-yard

plunge by 5-10 and 180-pound tailback Paul DeCamp. The kick was good.

A roughing the kicker penalty kept a Barlow drive alive in the fourth quarter. DeCamp scored on a three-yard plunge, going off right tackle for the second time. The kick was good.

The Pioneers shone at times. In the third quarter, after a 22-yard kickoff return by Brent Kearney, senior Gordon Brinser completed

passes of 35 and nine yards to senior Russell Fork.

After getting a first-and-10 on the 17, Sandy lost 11 yards on a sweep, 15 yards on a pass, and another five on a penalty.

With a fourth down on the 36, Byron punted. Skipper usually handles the punting duties, but he was out temporarily with a pinched nerve in his neck.

O'Meara was pleased with the way Brinser kept coming

back, and felt senior Pat Baird "did a pretty good job on the line."

Brinser completed six of 14 passes for 59 yards, with no interceptions. Chuck Kearney gained 67 yards on 17 carries.

Barlow gained 310 yards on the ground and another 65 in the air.

Frank McKinnis recovered a Barlow fumble for SUHS, and Baird was the leading tackler with nine.

The Pioneers, 0-2, take on David Douglas Friday at 7:30 p.m. at Pop Rannow Stadium.

David Douglas is 1-1, having won its opener 20-19 over non-league Milwaukie. The Scots fell 28-6 to The Dalles last week.

David Douglas reportedly likes the sweep, the option and trap plays. O'Meara described them as "fairly scrappy," and "not a bad team."


