

Hospice sets training for volunteers

Fall classes at Mt. Hood Community College are planned by Mt. Hood Hospice to train potential volunteers for the Sandy-based program of long-term home care for terminally ill patients and their families.

The course will meet 7-10 p.m. Mondays, Sept. 27 through Nov. 29, in Room 1575 for three college credits.

Various issues on dying, death and bereavement will be examined, with attention given to existing pertinent theory, relevant social processes, pain and symptom control, delivery of medical care, family dynamics and philosophical questions.

Interested students may attend single sessions at \$5 per night or the entire 10 weeks for a \$30 registration fee.

Classes topics will include the hospice concept (Sept. 27), terminal illness—a medical overview (Oct. 4), religion—suffering—suicide (Oct. 11), psycho-social needs (Oct. 18) and nursing (Oct. 25).

Other topics will include nursing (Nov. 1), funeral and closure (Nov. 8), dynamics of death and dying (Nov. 15), grief and bereavement (Nov. 22) and an overview with panel discussion (Nov. 29).

Advance registration is recommended through Mt. Hood Hospice, P.O. Box 284, Sandy 97055.

The course is co-sponsored by the college and Mt. Hood Hospice.

The cemetery association is updating maps and records. In some cases, they have had inquiries from other families who own lots in the old section of the cemetery and would like purchase some of those vacant lots near their family lots.

Because the Cliffside Cemetery Association is a chartered, non-profit organization, it cannot purchase the unused lots from the owners. However, if the lots are deeded back to the association, they can be resold.

Sexton Lloyd Boswell, who is responsible for the operation of the cemetery, said lots sell for \$150 and the association uses the money for improvements and maintenance.

Fish hatchery awarded BPA funds

A project to demonstrate the use of a marine thruster to generate power in a low-head application will get underway soon at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Eagle Creek fish hatchery.

It is one of nine projects designed to develop better, more cost-effective ways to generate electricity with renewable resources, being funded by the Bonneville Power Administration.

The BPA plans to spend up to \$3.5 million in fiscal 1983-84 on the projects which were selected from 161 proposed by private firms or individuals. The

Eagle Creek project is just one of four selected in Oregon.

The marine thrusters, to be used at the Eagle Creek fish hatchery, are used to

maneuver ships and tug boats with jets of water.

The sponsor, Energy Research & Applications, is working with the Fish and Wildlife Service. They

are seeking \$350,000 for design and construction costs.

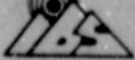
