

# Pioneers also strike quickly

The Pioneers started off controlling the ball. They took the opening kickoff and gradually drove down to the Pioneer two before turning the ball over with five minutes left in the first quarter.

The Dalles finally unleashed its passing attack near the end of the first quarter. The Dalles' Robertson caught three passes to set up a run by 6-1 and 185-pound Bob Eddy.

The kick for one was good. With 1:02 left in the first half, the Pioneers responded with an equally impressive passing attack. Quarterback Gordon Brinser hit Todd Byron twice, and then hit Russell Fork with a key 20-yarder.

Byron dove for the touchdown pass, a four-yarder, with one second showing as the referees signaled the score.

The kick was blocked, with

The Dalles taking a 7-6 halftime lead.

Coach Greg O'Meara said he wasn't really surprised at their ability to strike so quickly.

"I'm really proud of them for doing the things I knew they were capable of doing," he said of the four-pass drive.

The Dalles scored again with 5:23 left in the third quarter on a 10-yard pass, with the PAT kick good.

Kearney responded a minute and a half later with a 42-yard touchdown run, breaking tackles along the way. A run for two failed.

Kearney scored again just before the end of the quarter on an 11-yard run. After a penalty, a run for two failed.

Sandy went into the fourth quarter with an 18-14 lead.

The Pioneers gained 189 yards on the ground, according to SUHS statistics. Kearney gained 125 yards on

21 carries. Skipper gained 42 yards on 11 carries.

Brinser was eight for 14, for 95 yards. Byron caught five for 69 yards. Fork caught two for 21, and Steve Pettingill caught one for five yards.

Bill Bowman had a 20-yard kickoff return.

Skipper led the defense with 12 tackles. Frank McKinnis had 11 and Pat Baird had 10.

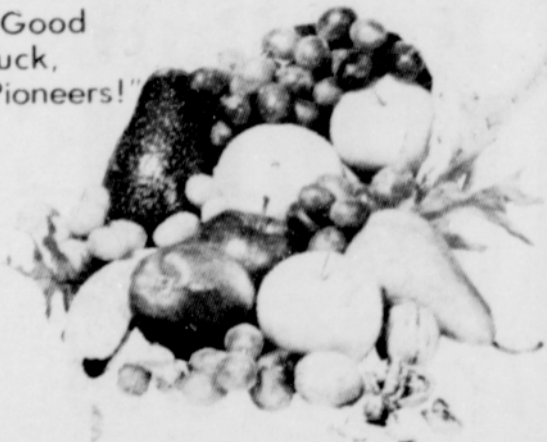
O'Meara estimated that The Dalles had about 200 yards passing and only about 25 yards on the ground.
