Adventists begin drive

The Seventh-day Adventists are making their 74th annual community appeal, beginning this Saturday in Sandy and ending next Saturday, Oct. 9.

The annual fund-raising drive has been conducted by Seventh-day Adventist Churches since 1908.

All solicitors in Sandy

will be identified, unpaid. Seventh-day Adventist volunteers. By using volunteers and existing channels for processing the funds, the church is able to eliminate overhead expenses.

Contributions are allocated to local, state and international programs according to need. Overseas, the church supports mission schools, leper colonies, clinics, medical launches emergency air service dispensaries, hospitals and relief units that are often the only facilities available to thousands of needy persons.

The annual Community Service Appeal is the public request for funds made by the Adventist Church. Only 10 percent of the total budget for Adventist humanitarian pro-

grams is received through the Community Service Appeal.

In the past year, Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Community Services sponsored five-day plans to stop smoking, hydrotherapy classes, stress control clinics, vegetarian cooking school, mobile health van and CPR Red Cross Classes.

The church also sponsored baby sitting certification class, weight control class, exercise class and cancer detection. All were open to the community.

The next five-day plan is set Oct. 17-21; the next CPR class is Nov. 21 and 22 at the Sandy Adventist Center.

David Salseth will return "home" when he and his wife, Carolyn, arrive in Zaire as church planting missionaries with the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Society of Wheaton, Ill.

Salseth grew up in Zaire where his parents, Harold and Joan Salseth, have served with CBFMS since 1949. Appointed to missionary service in June 1978, Salseth will speak about his goals at Pleasant Home Baptist Church, 32120 Dodge Park Blvd., this Sunday morning, Oct. 3, at the 11 a.m. service.

Salseth attended Judson Baptist College in Portland for two years before receiving his bachelor's degree in history from Westmont College in Santa Barbara, Calif., in 1971. That year he also served as a short-term worker in Zaire with CBFMS' Missionary Assistants Corps.

During Salseth's training at Western Conservative Baptist Seminary in Portland, where he earned a divinity degree in missions, he and his wife served as CBFMS short-term workers in Kenya in 1975.

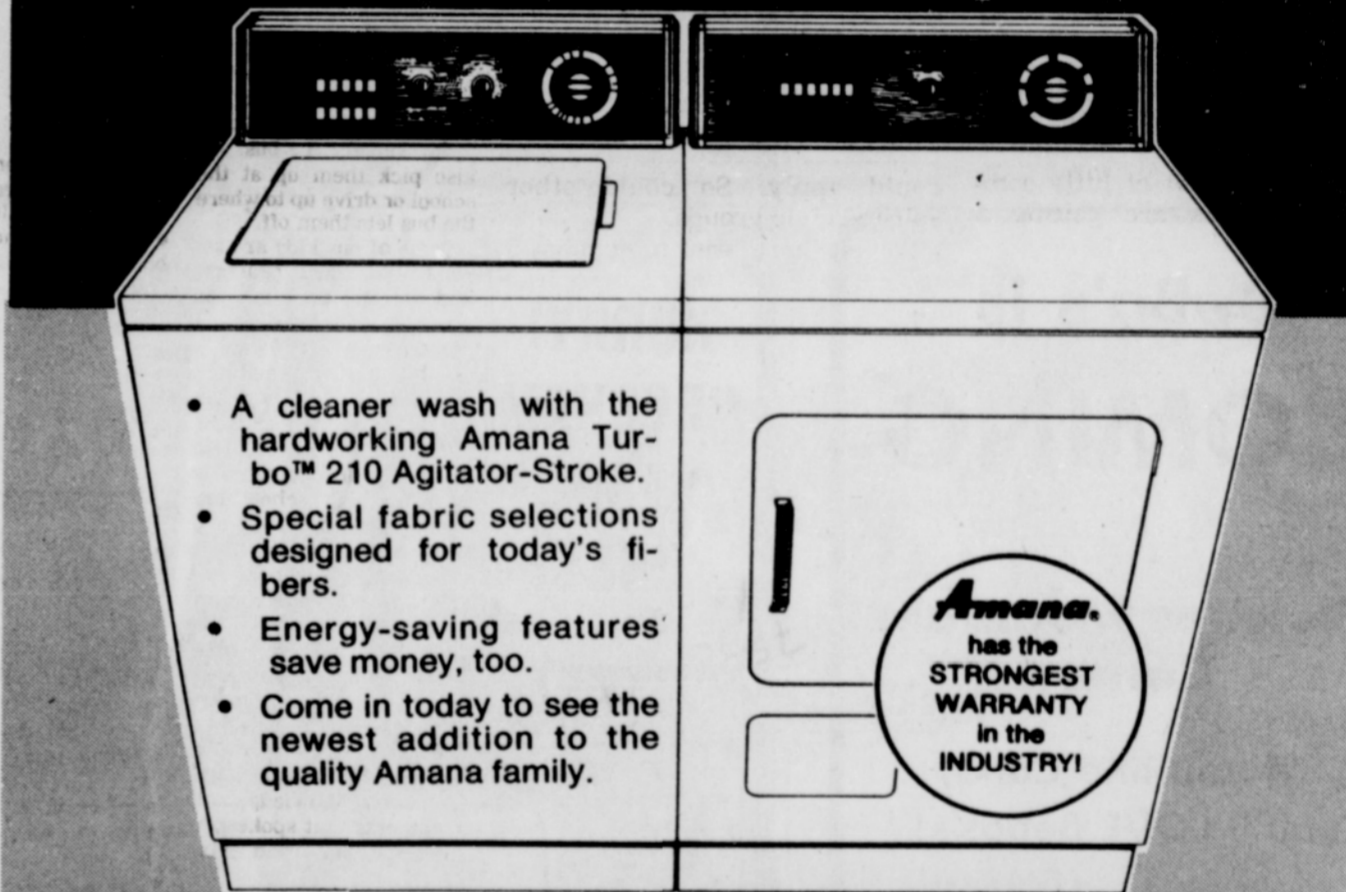

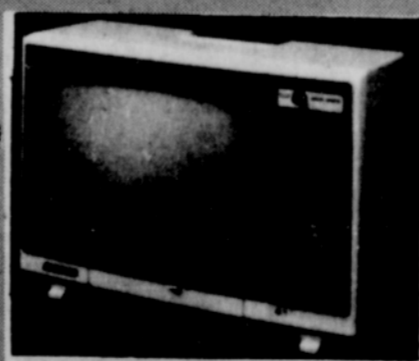
