The Sandy boys soccer team fell 6-1 to Gresham and 4-0 to Barlow in competition the past week. John Haugan scored the

Pioneers' goal on a penalty kick at the beginning of the second half Tuesday night. Gresham, paced by sophomore Mike Muters,

scored five times in the first 20 minutes. Muters is "real good," said Coach Lon Welsh. Hui Choi started defen-

ding him one-on-one after the first 20 minutes and held him to only one more goal in the game. Senior Tim Zimmerman

was credited with playing a good defensive game. Victor Martinez, a senior exchange student from Spain, was credited with doing a good job at center halfback, where he was playing for injured Kevin Fabryski.

Fabryski is out for "maybe a week" with a sprained ankle. Also the status of Joel Dose remains in question as he suffered a kidney injury against Barlow.

Hank Grenier played goalie the last 20 minutes against Gresham, and made six saves. "He played a real aggressive, real heads-up ball game," Welsh said.

Welsh added that despite the fact the team is struggling, the team members are playing with a lot of "pride, and courage under duress. 'The morale is high and they're working hard. I really appreciate that as a coach,'" he said.
