

## Wildlife photography class set

Chuck Coleman, professional photographer and teacher, is offering a one-evening seminar on wildlife and outdoor photography on Oct. 21 at the Western Forestry Center in Portland.

Designed to be helpful to those with all levels of expertise, the seminar will cover basic information on equipment, set-up, lighting and composition, with special tips on shooting various wildlife subjects. A question and answer period will follow.

Coleman works out of the Camera Connection, a studio and photography shop in Sandy, and is currently teaching photography at Mt. Hood Community College. He has 15 years experience in the field and his photographs have appeared in "National Geographic," "Skies West" and "Alaska Magazine," and other publications. He is now writing a three-part article for Pentax.

The seminar will run from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. in Miller Hall at the Forestry Center. Cost is \$1.50 for adults and \$1 for students under 13. Forestry Center members enter free.

The program is part of the monthly series of High Adventure Seminars offered by the Exploring Division of the Boy Scouts of America in conjunction with the Forestry Center. The public is invited.
