

Firm postpones move

A southern California electronics firm that requested information from Sandy as a possible relocation site apparently liked their answers, but has delayed any plans to move.

City planner Don Wilson helped the Sandy Chamber of Commerce field questions from Data-Chron of California, a small medium-skills employer of 20-50 workers.

Engineering manager Scott Seabaugh wrote Wilson that Sandy's response to Data-Chron's form letter was most complete.

"He wanted to know why Portland was not interested in a firm that could employ 40 to 50 persons," Wilson said.

Seabaugh added Sandy to the site search because of a relation's here interest of

many employees in skiing. Wilson credited relations and friendships with attracting many of Sandy's present industrial employers.

Unfortunately, Seabaugh also said the Santa Ana firm is postponing any relocation for another year or two, due to recent sales declines.

"They promised us they'd contact us again, before they make a commitment," Wilson said of their relocation plans.

The southern California firm seeks a 10,000-square-foot site, a medium-skill labor force of 20 or more and a nearby commercial airport. The city and chamber sent a packet on Sandy that indicated Sandy could meet all the requirements.
