## Top judging team headed for KC

After an "excellent" outing at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition at the Portland Exposition Center, Sandy FFA members are ready for a trip to Kansas City.

At the PI earlier this month 32 FFA members took 62 animals (hogs and sheep) to the livestock show, with seven of them going through the Blue Ribbon sale, where it's not unusual for buyers to show up in limousines.

Mike Payne did especially well, having raised the reserve grand champion market hog.

The care and feeding of an animal, as well as the stock, are important for doing well at a show, according to DeAnn McDermid, president of the FFA, and Ami Aschoff, vice president.

Also, the Sandy chapter took first in herdsman for sheep, and second for herdsman for sheep.

The FFA members were judged on how clean the area was kept, as well as whether the animals had food and water at all times, among other factors.

On any evening there are likely to be FFA members working at the SUHS barn north of Pop Rannow Stadium. Aschoff said Les Geren, the FFA advisor, is responsible for much of the success enjoyed by the club.

"He has a lot of enthusiasm and he creates a good atmosphere for everybody," she said, adding that the group effort is stressed over the in-

dividual. "Even the work is fun because we do it all together," Aschoff said. "One reason Aschoff likes FFA is because the work can be applied. She'd eventually like to go into partnership with her father, Carl, a veterinarian."

McDermid was influenced early, with her brother having been in FFA. "He got awards and I thought that was neat," McDermid said. Also, she said she likes Geren.

The SUHS board of directors recently approved a trip to Kansas City for the dairy judging team, which finished first in state competition last spring.

Aschoff aced the general knowledge test, a part of

the judging competition. McDermid said tasting dairy products for off-flavors is a tough part of the competition. "Sometimes it's bad," she said.

Members of the dairy judging team are McDermid, Aschoff, Kristie Markwell, Julie Ferdun and Jennifer Mann.

Also making the trip in early November will be Robby Swan and Doug Butler, who were recently selected by other members of the club.
