Howell cast in 'Antigone'

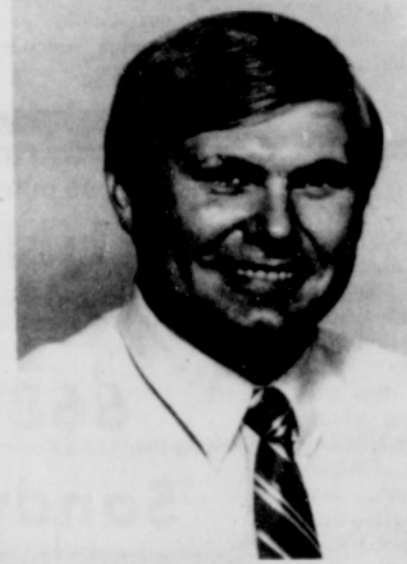
Catrina Howell, a freshman at Linfield College in McMinnville, has been cast in the role of Antigone in Jean Anouilh's "Antigone."
