Committee to review sex education films

A special educational screening committee will review films dealing with drug abuse, human development and child abuse before they are at Welches Grade School.

The committee's formation was authorized by the school board at its October meeting after parents complained that certain films were shown in health and science classes.

Welches Superintendent Kenneth Blackburn said one of the films which raised concerns was entitled "I Was A Teen-Age Father."

The screening committee

will be made up of eight persons. Five of these will be selected from a cross-section of the community, including churches and civic groups, as well as young and old. A representative from the administration, the board and the faculty will fill the remaining positions.

Any person interested in serving on the committee is asked to contact the board chairperson Dick Hoffman through the school. The committee will be appointed by the board's Nov. 11 meeting.

Graveside services for longtime Wemme resident William Gerald Lymp were held Oct. 20 at the Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

Mr. Lymp died from cancer at his home on Oct. 16. He was 76 years old.

Born March 25, 1906 in Willamette, he moved with his family to Wemme when he was 11. Except for some short leaves for military duty he lived all his life in Wemme. He attended Sandy schools and graduated from Sandy High School.

Mr. Lymp had been employed for 25 years as a county road superintendent for Clackamas County. He retired in 1970.

He was a member of the St. John's of the Wood Catholic Church in Wemme.

Survivors are his children, Joseph of Bend and Salley Kennington of Wilsonville; brothers, Leo and Joseph, both of Wemme, and Linus of Victorville, Calif., and sisters, Zita Kaiser of Wemme and Mercedes Christopher of Hood River.

Funeral services for Sandy resident Ethel Henley were held Tuesday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Private interment followed at Firhill Memorial Cemetery in Sandy.

Mrs. Henley was born Nov. 5, 1906 in Ava, Mo. She was raised in Missouri where she received her education.

After she married Otis L. Henley, they lived in Missouri until the early 1940s when they moved to California where their daughter was born.

In 1944 the Henleys moved to Sandy. Mrs. Henley worked for a time at Ogden's Variety Store.

She died Oct. 23 in Gresham at 75 years of age.

Survivors include her husband; her daughter, Helen Knudsen in California; three brothers, Elmer Hodge and Ray Hodge, both of Sandy, and Grant Hodge in Missouri.
