Superintendent explains bid process

Kenneth Blackburn, superintendent of the Welches School District, offered explanation as to why it took over a month for a bid to be approved so repairs could be made to school property.
The incident involved the uprooting of a 65-foot cottonwood tree, which damaged a cyclone fence and a light pole. The bid to make the necessary repairs was recently awarded to Cascade

General Repair, for \$125 plus materials. Board Member Bruce Erickson questioned why it took so long to award the bid when the repair cost was so minor. He also expressed concern that someone could have been injured during this period of time.
Blackburn said the board, at its September meeting, had requested that bids be solicited for the repairs. He said he returned with the bids at the Oc-

tober meeting, where a contract was then awarded to the lowest bidder. This is the procedure established by the board and the delay was not due to his actions.

MEASURE 3-14
Submitted to the legal voters of said district.
CLACKAMAS CO. SCHOOL DIST. NO. 13
QUESTION: Shall the Welches School District establish a tax base of \$900,000 to become effective on July 1, 1983?
PURPOSE: The purpose of the measure is to increase the tax base of Clackamas County School District No. 13 from \$524,047 to \$900,000. It is submitted in accordance with Article XI, Section 11, of the Oregon Constitution.
The tax base increase is needed to support the educational programs for the district's children. The tax base will fund the district's programs for three years without referral to a special levy. If the measure is approved, the new tax base amount will qualify for tax relief.

Submitted to the legal voters of said district.
TAX BASE ELECTION
QUESTION: Shall a tax base of \$2,592,875.00 be established for Sandy Elementary School District No. 46, Sandy, Oregon?
PURPOSE: This measure establishes a \$2,592,875.00 tax base pursuant to Article XI, Section 11, of the Oregon Constitution. The district does not have an existing tax base. The measure grants permanent tax levy authority granting the school board to levy not more than \$2,592,875.00 beginning with the fiscal year 1983-'84. In future years, the levy cannot be increased by more than 6% of the tax base without voter approval.
The Sandy Elementary District offers free public education for approximately 1,500 children from grades one through eight. The district has no tax base and, therefore, the dollar amount is zero. The district cannot operate a fiscal year without property tax income.
Currently, this district receives partial state funding only on an "A" ballot levy and is not eligible to receive any state funding on a "B" ballot levy. This tax base would guarantee partial state funding on the District's tax levy.
