Bad connection sparks fire

A faulty connection resulted in a fire that destroyed a 1965 Chevrolet Sport Van last Wednesday evening.

The fire which burned the van, owned by Alan Erickson, 11301 SE Bluff Road, started in a loose connection on the amp gauge, according to Sandy Fire Marshal Jim Gallagher. The van was valued at \$1,000.

Since Oct. 19, Sandy fire district personnel have responded to 28 alarms including 19 first aid calls, three chimney fires, two minor motor vehicle accidents, one false alarm and two mutual aids with Boring Fire District, in addition to the car fire.

Sandy firefighters have answered 709 alarms during 1982. Gallagher predicts that number may rise above 900 before the year ends.

City abandons after-hours hook-ups

The city of Sandy is no longer obliged to turn on water service after business hours or on weekends for local residents who have failed to pay their bills on time.

The Sandy City Council Monday night OK'd an ordinance which establishes a reconnection fee of \$10 during office hours. Delinquent payments will also be required in full before the reconnection is made. Reconnection of water service will not be made after

5 p.m. Monday through Friday or on weekends or holidays.

That action came despite some concern about possible health hazards.

Under the new ordinance, service could be re-established in the event of a health hazard during off hours, but the city is not obligated because water service turnoffs are the result of delinquency of bills.

In other action, the Sandy

City Council: —Endorsed an annexation request by Brad Picking to bring approximately three acres into the city on the north side of Highway 26 adjacent to Janz Berryland.

The request must now go before the Portland Metropolitan Boundary Commission for final approval.

Upon that approval, the city will rezone the property for general commercial

use.

Under the terms of council approval, Picking will provide sanitary sewer for the property and traffic patterns will be considered by the city and the state Highway Division prior to development.

—Appointed Harvey Schneider to the Sandy Design Review Board. He replaces Judy Berger who has resigned because her family is moving out of state.

—Declared Nov. 7-14 National Hospice Week in the city of Sandy, citing Mt. Hood Hospice and the "public need to promote public awareness of hospice care as one alternative to institutionalization for terminally ill persons."

Boring man arrested after shot fired

A Boring man was arrested early Sunday morning after shots were fired in the parking lot at Toni's Restaurant and Lounge.

Kerry Dean Bredenkamp, 31, was charged with recklessly endangering after he told police he was shooting at streetlights.

Sandy police officers David Farmer and Carl Faught were leaving Sandy City Hall at 12:40 a.m. when they heard what appeared to be a large caliber gunshot in the lounge's parking lot.

When they arrived, Farmer saw the barrel of a rifle pointing out of the driver's window of a pickup truck, pointed in the direction of several cars. Twenty

to 25 persons were in the line of fire.

After police arrested the suspect, a search of the truck discovered a spent .30-30 caliber cartridge.

Bredenkamp was taken to Clackamas County Jail where he was held on \$1,500 bail.

Two Sandy men were injured early Sunday morning when the vehicle they were in left the road on Tupper Road and struck a tree.

Driver of the car, Ronald Scott Coombs, 21, suffered lacerations and his passenger, Michael James Urwin, 20, suffered a broken tooth and injured knee in the accident.

According to local police reports, Coombs was driv-

ing south on Tupper Road when he lost control of his 1980 Chevrolet Monza and crashed into a tree. He was cited for driving with a suspended license.
