Area restrooms 'over taxed'

Restaurant owners along the Mt. Hood corridor recently delivered a letter to the state Highway Division requesting that a public restroom facility be established in the area.

The past few years, the restrooms in restaurants along the corridor have been "over taxed" by tourist traffic, said Beth Baker, former secretary-treasurer of the Rhododendron Neighborhood Group, which initiated the campaign.

Between Sandy and Government Camp the only place people can make a rest stop, said Baker, is either at service stations or restaurants. Generally, people prefer to stop at the restaurants.

The direct result of this overuse, said Baker, is that the septic systems of the restaurants have developed problems. What

is needed is an alternative rest area, and this should be the responsibility of the Highway Department, which has gone on record as being concerned about both accommodating, and increasing, tourism in Oregon.

Baker said the ideal place is midway between Sandy and the ski areas, at Clackamas County's Hoodland Park, located on

Salmon River Road next to the Women's Club in Zig Zag.

Already at that location there are restrooms available but their location is not well publicized, said Baker. In addition, increased use of these facilities would mean a cost in upgrading them.

Currently, Baker said the Highway Division is studying locations.

\$1.1 million suit set for trial

A civil suit involving the theft of timber from Clackamas County land on South Boulder Creek, south of Brightwood, is scheduled to go to trial March 7, 1983.

The county is seeking recovery of over \$1.1 million in damages against Tim McCoy Henderson, formerly of Sleepy Hollow and now residing in Gresham.

Rebekah Lodge plans bazaar

The Boring Rebekah Lodge is sponsoring a bazaar Nov. 6 at the Grange Hall from 9:30 a.m. till 4:30 p.m.

Hand-crafted items will be available, and lunch will be served.

It is alleged that Henderson, operating through his firm, Henderson Forest Products, intentionally and unlawfully removed 1.2 million board feet of salable soft wood valued at \$370,000. The county is seeking \$1,110,000 in damages, triple the value of the timber.

In addition the county is asking \$750,000 in punitive damages and for court costs.

During the course of Henderson's operations on county land, he reportedly stole timber from the U.S. Bureau of Land Management. He was recently found guilty by a jury in

Federal District Court for removing 327,000 board feet of timber from the BLM parcel, as well as 300,000 board feet of timber from Forest Service land along Lolo Pass Road, north of Zig Zag.

The county has also named Cascade Timber Company of Tacoma in the lawsuit. They had contracted with Henderson to log timber from private land adjacent to South Boulder Creek.

According to Cynthia Phillips, assistant Clackamas County counsel, civil damages against Henderson will be actively pursued whether

he claims assets or not.

Phillips said if it is found that Henderson has no assets it will not prevent the county from getting a judgment so the damages can be collected when he does secure assets.

In the past Henderson has had land, equipment and other assets in his name, said Phillips. The county "will attempt to attach his land or other assets in a lawful manner so we can recoup our losses."

Henderson was represented by a court-appointed attorney at the trial in federal court in September.

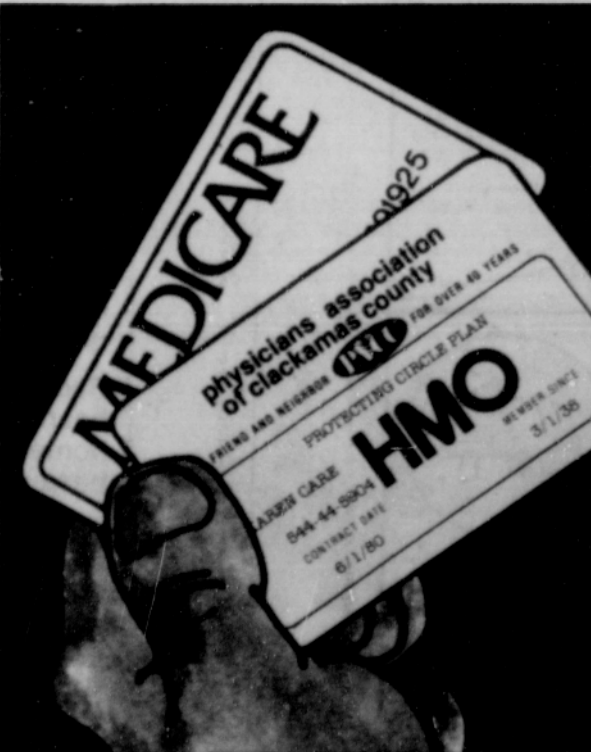
