## Concert to benefit family

A benefit concert for the family of a 35-year-old Brightwood man who was recently killed in Chicago will be held Thursday, Nov. 11 at the Mt. Hood Lions Club at 7 p.m.

Steve Giuntini, a local carpenter, was known as a craftsman. He had worked for local construction companies in the Sandy-Mt. Hood area, building both frame and log houses. He later subcontracted work and remodeled houses.

In September, after falling victim to the depressed economy, he moved his family to Chicago where he

secured full-time employment in the construction industry. The move was to be temporary.

At 3 a.m. on Oct. 31, Giuntini was killed in a single-car collision accident in Des Plaines, Ill., a Chicago suburb. He is survived by his wife, Marilyn, and daughters Heather, 8, and Allison, 10 months.

The benefit, according to organizers Cheryl Etteman and Dawn Morrison, is to assist his family with expenses.

The benefit will feature a number of mountain musi-

cians who have donated their talents to the cause. Some of the people scheduled to perform include Will Frank, the owner of The Store—Natural Foods and Cafe in Welches, Marie Kennedy, a checker at Hoodland Thriftway, and Jon Adams, owner of Mountain Metric.

Also scheduled to perform is Tim McCarthy, a music teacher at Welches Grade School, and Rsty Reagan. Until a short time ago, McCarthy and Reagan were musicians in the rock group the Bo Cody Band.

Charlie McCarthy, a cowboy singer who use to perform with the Sons of the Pioneers, will also appear.

Admission will be \$3.50 per person or \$5 a couple. Included in the cost will be food and refreshments, which were donated by local businesses.

## Woodcutters remain in critical condition

Two woodcutters, injured in separate incidents two weeks ago, remain hospitalized with head injuries.

Tom Blessing, a 36-year-old Rhododendron resident who suffered head injuries while winching a log during a woodcutting operation, remains hospitalized at Emanuel Hospital. The accident occurred near White River on Oct. 25.

According to Brenda Williams, a secretary with the Emanuel Hospital public relations office, Blessing is still listed in critical condition. His status, she said, has not changed since he was transported to the medical center by a Life Flight helicopter.

Donald A. Green, who

resides at 11817 S.E. 108th in Portland, was injured on Oct. 27 while felling a tree in the Lolo Pass area.

Green was given emergency medical treatment by medics from the Hoodland Rural Fire Department. He was flown to Portland Adventist Medical Center by a Life Flight helicopter, where he was admitted for head injuries sustained in the accident.

On Monday, Patty Godman, a secretary with the hospital's office of development and public relations, said Green's condition remains critical.

The 33-year-old Green is a senior pastor.
