PGE revamps deposit plan

A new deposit program went into effect for Portland General Electric's residential customers which balances the need to reduce uncollectible accounts with concern for those who have difficulty paying their bills.

Under the PGE program, a deposit of one month's bill is required from customers who have less than six months credit history and do not pass a credit screen. In addition, a one month deposit is asked of customers who have had two to four disconnect notices and one or two field calls by company personnel in the past six to 12 months.

Deposits of two months average bill are only asked of customers who have extremely poor credit histories with PGE. This includes a disconnect for non-payment during the past year; failure to pay at a prior address, or the use of false information to obtain a previous exemption from making a deposit.

As an alternative to making a deposit, a letter of guarantee can be submitted by a third party who is a PGE customer with good credit standing.

An important part of the policy is the involvement of social service agencies. With agency referral and recommendation, customers with financial problems can be granted five additional days beyond the normal three days to make their initial deposit payment and three months instead of one month to pay the balance.
