## SUHS grad lands MHCC play lead

A 1982 Sandy High School graduate will play the lead role when the Theater Arts Program of Mt. Hood Community College presents the Portland Metro area's first production of the play "The Elephant Man," opening this weekend in the Studio Theater at 8 p.m.

Rob Lawson will play John Merrick, born with such deformities that he was exhibited as a freak until saved from this ignominious existence by a young surgeon, Dr. Frederick Treves.

In spite of his physical appearance, Merrick has a sensitive and perceptive mind, and entered the circles of the upper classes of the late Victorian period in England.

Unlike the movie of the same name, the play does not use exaggerated make-up to portray the deformities. Instead, Lawson contorts his body and voice to give the illusion of deformity.

Lawson has been active in drama since the eighth grade when he played the Beast in "Beauty and the Beast." He serves on the board of directors for the Sandy Community Theater where he has performed in several productions, most recently "Tribute" and "I've Got Rhythm." He also directed "The Woolgatherer" for the Sandy Community Players.

He is now attending MHCC on a talent tuition scholarship for theater.

The play is directed by Richard Melo, director of theater, and the cast consists of nine actors who double playing many roles. The play will be presented Nov. 12, 13, 18, 19 and 20 in the Studio Theater at 8 p.m.

## By liquor funds

# Sandy revenues boosted

The Oregon Liquor Control Commission reported this week that liquor revenue distributed during the 1981-82 fiscal year amounted to more than \$72 million, an increase of 3.12 percent over the 1980-81 fiscal year.

Cities and counties receive a share of the funds in proportion to population. The city of Sandy received \$26,502.80, and Clackamas County received \$576,296.78 for the recently-completed fiscal year. This does not include funds received from City Revenue Sharing or Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services accounts.

Liquor sales statewide exceeded all previous fiscal years, amounting to more than \$154 million.

This was an increase of one-tenth percent over the 1980-81 fiscal year.

The State General Fund received \$39,421.11; the incorporated cities, \$12,475,505; the counties, \$6,237,752; and the City

Revenue Sharing account, \$8,732,853. The Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services account received 50 percent of the gross taxes collected on beer and wine, amounting to \$5,407,973.
